> A BILL
for

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    AN ACT relating to education; providing curricula
    requirements for the Hathaway scholarship program;
    providing for implementation; repealing obsolete
    provisions; and providing for an effective date.
    Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
            Section 1. 21-16-1303(b)(ii) and 21-16-1307 by
    creating new paragraphs (b) through (d) and renumbering (b)
    as (e) are amended to read:
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            21-16-1303. Hathaway scholarship program; eligibility
    requirements.
    (b) Under the Hathaway scholarship program, subject to availability of funds as determined by the legislature, the state shall provide a scholarship pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1304 and 21-16-1305 to any student who has been accepted by and enrolls in an eligible institution to pursue a degree or certificate, and who meets the following qualifications:
(ii) The student has successfully completed a curriculum as established by and pursuant to W.S. 21-161307 and meets standards for admission to the eligible institution; Until success curricula requirements are established pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1307, the curriculum requirement of this paragraph for Hathaway scholarship recipients shall be that required for high school graduation under W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iii). For first-time students who enroll in an eligible institution in the fall ef 2011, and thereafter, curriculum requirements for a scholarship under this article shall be as established pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1307; and

## 21-16-1307. Success curriculum; test standards.

(a) Not later than october 1, 2006, the department shall recommend to the governor and the joint education interim committec of the legislature, in consultation with school districts, the University of Wyoming, each Wyoming community college and the Wyoming community college eommission:
(i) The contents of an appropriate success eurriculum for Hathaway opportunity, performance and honor scholarship students and, in consultation with each community college and the commission, the contents of an appropriate success curriculum for Hathaway carecr scholarship students. The success curricula shall, upon approval of the legislature, enable students entering high school in the fall of 2007 to pursue those curricula for scholarship eligibility under this article beginning with the fall of 2011. The success curricula shall include at least four (1) years each of mathematics, science, and reading/language arts, three (3) years of social studics and a study of a foreign language in grades 9 through 12 . The department shall by rule and regulation establish eweptions to the sucess eurrieula for students attending or graduating from an eligible high school not qualifying as a prototypical high school under Wyoming law;

scholarship eligibility under this article for students

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    graduating from high school in the 2010-2011 school year
    shall be as follows:
    (i) Math - four (4) years of math in grades nine
    (9) through twelve (12) to include those specified in
    subparagraphs (A) through (D) of this paragraph. Courses
    which are the functional equivalent of the specified
    courses, including courses taken before grade nine (9), may
    be used to satisfy the level of the requirements of this
    paragraph. Except as provided in subparagraph (E) of this
    paragraph, four (4) years of math shall be required in
    grades nine (9) through twelve (12):
    (A) Algebra I;
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    (B) Algebra II;
    (C) Geometry; and
    (D) One (1) of the following:
        (I) Statistics;
    (II) An additional rigorous math course

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which requires Algebra II or geometry as a stated or
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practical prerequisite; or
(III) An additional math course which
addresses the components of Algebra II or geometry and
which meets requirements established by rule of the
department, if the student is advised by a high school
counselor to take the course as a result of an ACT score.
(E) The department shall by rule provide
for waiver of the requirement that four (4) years of math
be taken in grades nine (9) through twelve (12), if a
student has taken the equivalent of the four (4) required
courses, has taken any of the four (4) prior to grade nine
(9), and does not have the practical ability to take a
fourth year math course in grades nine (9) through twelve
(12) because the student's school does not provide
additional courses and no additional courses are
practicably available to the student at a postsecondary
institution.
*** STAFF COMMENTS ***
The math requirement is perhaps the most
complicated. The Committee is urged to review
the draft carefully to ensure that it meets the
intent of the various motions of the last
meeting. As written, a student who takes Algebra I in eighth grade is subject to greater requirements than the student who takes Algebra I in ninth grade. That is the effect of the proposal as implemented by the Committee's motions; that may or may not have been intended. Please also carefully review the language of subparagraph (E) as the language was altered slightly to meet what appeared to be the intent of the motion.

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        (ii) Language arts - four (4) years of language
    arts at the college or industry preparatory level in grades
    nine (9) through twelve (12), to include reading, writing,
    listening and speaking;
    (iii) Science - four (4) years of science in
    grades nine (9) through twelve (12) to include at least
    three (3) years of those courses specified in subparagraphs
    (A) through (F) of this paragraph and a fourth year from
    any of those specified in subparagraphs (A) through (G) of
    this paragraph:
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        (A) Physics I;
        (B) Physics II;
        (C) Chemistry I;
    (D) Chemistry II;
(E) Biology I;
(F) Biology II;
(G) A rigorous science course meeting
requirements established by rule of the department.
*** STAFF comments ***
The motion for the "rigorous science course" did
not include the phrase regarding "establishing
the requirements by rule of the department." The
detail of what is "rigorous" is not needed in
statute, but some legislative or administrative
direction needs to be given.

(v) Foreign language - two (2) sequenced years
of the same foreign language, one (1) of which shall be in
grades nine (9) through twelve (12). A proficiency
examination meeting requirements established by rule of the

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department may meet either or both years of the
requirements of this paragraph.
    **** STAFF COMMENTS *** 
    (c) The success curricula required to qualify for
    scholarship eligibility under this article for students
    graduating from high school prior to the 2010-2011 school
    year shall be as follows:
    (i) For students graduating in the 2007-2008
    school year:
            (A) Math - Algebra I;
            (B) Science - one (1) of the courses
    specified in subparagraphs (b)(iii)(A) through (F) of this
    section.
        (ii) For students graduating in the 2008-2009
        school year:
        (A) Math:
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(I) Algebra I; and
(II) Geometry.
(B) Science - two (2) of the courses

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    specified in subparagraphs (b)(iii)(A) through (F) of this
    section;
    subject matter of world history.
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        (iii) For students graduating in the 2009-2010
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    school year:
        (A) Math:
        (I) Algebra I;
        (II) Geometry; and
    > (III) Algebra II.

> (B) Science - three (3) of the courses
specified in subparagraphs (b) (iii) (A) through (F) of this
section;
(C) Social studies - courses covering the
subject matter of:
(I) World history; and
(II) American history.
(d) The courses set forth as success curricula
requirements shall be aligned with the student content and
performance standards established pursuant to W.S. 21-2-
304(a)(iii) The department shall by rule and regulation
establish exceptions to the success curricula for students
attending or graduating from an eligible high school not
qualifying as a prototypical high school under Wyoming law.
*** STAFF COMMENTS ***
The current requirement for success curricula
during the "phase-in" period was the high school
graduation requirements. That is repealed
earlier in the bill and has not been included in
the phase-in section. If the Committee believes
it is necessary, it can be included in the

## introduction to the phase-in success curricula requirements.

(b) (e) Not later than October 1, 2007, and by October 1 in each odd-numbered year thereafter, the department, in consultation with the University of Wyoming, Wyoming community colleges and the community college commission, shall report to the governor and the joint education interim committee of the legislature on recommendations for modifications to the minimum cumulative GPA and minimum composite ACT or cumulative WORKKEYS scores contained in this article to ensure that the Hathaway scholarship program is designed to provide the desired incentives for students to pursue a rigorous curriculum and strive to achieve academic success. The cumulative GPA requirements for performance under the success curricula shall not be restricted to those courses comprising the success curricula, but shall be applied comprehensively to all courses included within each scholarship student's high school curricula.

21-16-1308. Administration; rules and regulations.
(b) The department shall, in consultation with University of Wyoming and community college admissions

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officers and financial aid officers and school districts,
promulgate rules and regulations necessary to implement
this article, including:
    (vii) Implementing success curricula requirements
    as authorized by W.S. 21-16-1307;
    (vii)(viii) Any other rules and regulations
necessary for the implementation and administration of this
article.
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    Section 2. W.S. 21-16-1307(a) is repealed.
    Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon
    completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
Constitution.
