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6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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8	Section 1. 21-16-1307 by creating a new subsection (c)
9	is amended to read:
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11	21-16-1307. Success curriculum; test standards.

13	(c) From the information provided pursuant to W.S.
14	21-16-1308(b)(i), each school district shall provide every
15	student registering for ninth grade a summary of available
16	Hathaway scholarships, curriculum requirements to earn a

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1	scholarship and earning differences anticipated at various
2	post-secondary education levels. Students enrolling for
3	grade nine (9) in the 2007-2008 school year and thereafter
4	shall be registered for the courses necessary to allow the
5	student to complete the success curricula required under
6	this section for Hathaway scholarship recipients in each
7	year of grades nine (9) through twelve (12) unless the
8	student and the student's parent or guardian execute a
9	written waiver in accordance with this subsection.
10	Together with the other information required under this
11	subsection each student enrolling in ninth grade shall be
12	provided a waiver form which explains that by signing the
13	waiver the student and parent understand the student is
14	electing not to take a curriculum which is required for a
15	Hathaway scholarship and that by doing so the student may
16	be limiting opportunities for other scholarships available
17	to attend college. For any student initially enrolling in
18	a school district in grades ten (10) through twelve (12) in
19	the 2007-2008 school year and thereafter, the district
20	shall provide the same information and waiver unless the
21	student and his parent have previously executed a waiver in
22	another Wyoming school district or the student can no
23	longer meet the curriculum requirements of this section.
24	No school district or employee or agent thereof shall be

1	held liable in any manner for failing to comply with any
2	provision of this subsection.
3	
4	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2007.
