## Proposed amendment number 3 to 07 LSO 0129.W2

This amendment would require the department of education to report recommendations for changes to the success curriculum and the use of state assessments for Hathaway eligibility determinations. The current draft bill repeals the references to those as executed provisions since they were due to be reported by October 1, 2006. The amendment would also require the department to include in its annual report on the Hathaway program the percentage of high school graduates who meet the success curriculum requirements.

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(b) Not later than October 1, 2007, and by October 1 in each oddnumbered year thereafter, the department, in consultation with the University of Wyoming, Wyoming community colleges and the community college commission, shall report to the governor and the education interim committee of the legislature for modifications to the success curricula recommendations requirements, minimum cumulative GPA and minimum composite ACT or cumulative WORKKEYS scores contained in this article and recommendations for the adoption of statewide student assessment standards and scores to augment qualifying ACT or WORKKEYS scores, all to ensure that the Hathaway scholarship program is designed to provide the desired incentives for students to pursue a rigorous curriculum and strive to achieve academic success. The cumulative GPA requirements for performance under the success curricula shall not be restricted to those courses comprising the success curricula, but shall be applied comprehensively to all courses included within each scholarship student's high school curricula.

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31 32 (c) The department shall establish annual reporting procedures for purposes of policy analysis and program evaluation and providing accurate data to the legislature and governor relative to the program's impact on the state and on students. In developing the annual reporting procedure the department shall consult with the University of Wyoming and community college financial aid officers and registrars or their designees. It is the intention of the legislature that the reporting system and the requirements thereof shall be applicable to all recipients of scholarships under this article. Compliance with this section shall be made a condition of receiving a scholarship under this article. The reporting system shall include the following information:

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(vi) An annual report on the number of applicants as well as the percent of high school graduates by high school district who meet the success curriculum requirements, the percent who apply for a scholarship by scholarship category, and the percent of those students who are awarded a scholarship and subsequently enroll in an eligible institution; BOGGS
