The budget division and department shall consider those 8 9 recommendations in developing budgets and submitting 10 recommendations to the governor pursuant to subsection (b) 11 of this section. When distributing the overall state 12 budget to the legislature, the governor shall forward the 13 recommendations of the state employee compensation 14 commission and shall summarize the manner in which the proposed budget reflects those recommendations. 15
