A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to the administration of government; 1 creating a task force to study Wyoming lien statutes; 2 specifying membership and duties; requiring a report; 3 4 providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective 5 date. 6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 7 8 9 Section 1. 10 11 (a) There is created a lien study task force. 12 13 (b) The task force shall be comprised of: 14

(i) Two (2) members of the Wyoming senate, 1 2 appointed by the president of the senate. Not more than 3 one (1) member shall be of the same political party. The 4 president of the senate shall designate a cochairman of the 5 task force; 6 7 (ii) Two (2) members of the Wyoming house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house. 8 9 Not more than one (1) member shall be of the same political The speaker of the house shall designate a 10 partv. cochairman of the task force; 11 12 13 (iii) The following members selected jointly by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house: 14 15 16 (A) Two (2) members of the Wyoming state 17 bar, practicing in probate law; 18 19 (B) One (1) person representing title 20 insurance and title services companies; 21 22 (C) One (1) person who is a building industry contractor; 23 24

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(D) One (1) person representing the real 1 2 estate industry; 3 4 (E) One (1) person representing landowners; 5 6 (F) One (1) person representing oilfield 7 contractors; 8 9 (G) One (1) person representing the banking 10 industry; 11 12 (iv) One (1) person from the Wyoming office of state lands and investments appointed by the governor; 13 14 15 (c) The task force shall: 16 17 (i) Meet no less than four (4) times; 18 19 (ii) Conduct a comprehensive analysis of the 20 Wyoming lien statutes, to identify inefficiencies, 21 inconsistencies and unnecessary procedures that may complicate lien procedures for individual landowners, 22 contractors, materialmen, realtors, the financial industry, 23 creditors and their representatives; 24

1 2 (iii) Develop recommendations to simplify 3 procedures and eliminate inefficiencies and 4 inconsistencies, and submit draft legislation for 5 consideration by the joint judiciary interim committee; 6 (iv) Report its findings and recommendations to 7 the joint judiciary interim committee no later than 8 9 November 1, 2007. 10 (d) Legislators serving on the task force shall be 11 paid salary, per diem and travel expenses as provided in 12 W.S. 28-5-101 for their official duties as members of the 13 14 task force. Any state agency personnel serving on the task force shall receive per diem and travel expenses as 15 provided in W.S. 9-3-102, paid from their agency budget. 16 17 Other nonlegislative members serving on the task force shall receive travel and per diem expenses incurred for 18 their official duties as members of the task force in the 19 20 same amount as legislators under W.S. 28-5-101. 21 22 (e) The task force shall be staffed by the legislative service office. State agencies, including the 23

University of Wyoming, shall assist the task force as 1 2 requested in conducting its duties under this act.

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Section 2. There is appropriated twenty thousand 4 5 dollars (\$20,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative service office to fund the meetings of the task 6 7 force.

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9 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 10 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 11 Wyoming Constitution. 12
