A BILL

- 1 AN ACT relating to state retirement; providing for a study
- 2 of the establishment of an emergency medical technician
- 3 retirement program as specified; requiring a report;
- 4 providing an appropriation and providing for an effective

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9 Section 1.

- 11 (a) Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) is
- 12 appropriated from the general fund to the department of
- 13 health for the balance of the fiscal biennium ending June
- 14 30, 2008 to contract with a certified actuary for a study
- 15 and development of actuarial information necessary to
- 16 establish a retirement program for Wyoming emergency

- medical technicians. The program shall be similar to the 1
- 2 volunteer firemen's pension fund established pursuant to
- 3 W.S. 35-9-601 through 35-9-615. The study shall:

- 5 (i) Make an actuarial determination of the costs
- of a retirement program covering full-time, part-time and 6
- 7 volunteer emergency medical technicians in Wyoming;

- 9 (ii) Identify possible funding sources for the
- program; 10

- 12 (iii) Compare the advantages and disadvantages
- 13 of a defined benefit or a defined contribution plan;

14

- 15 (iv) Identify necessary or recommended
- 16 differences between an EMT retirement program and the
- 17 volunteer firemen's pension fund;

- 19 (v) Recommend whether the program should be part
- 20 of an existing retirement plan or an entirely new plan.

- 22 (b) The department of health shall report the results
- of the actuarial study to the joint labor, health and 23
- 24 social services interim committee and the joint

- appropriations interim committee not later than November 1, 1
- 2 2007. In addition, the department shall report to the
- joint labor, health and social services interim committee 3
- 4 regarding recommendations for other recruitment and
- retention incentives for emergency medical technicians, 5
- 6 whether administered by the department or otherwise, and
- 7 the availability of training grants for EMT candidates.

- This act is effective immediately upon 9 Section 2.
- completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 10
- as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 11 Wyoming
- 12 Constitution.
