2	establishing an education loan repayment program for

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4 (a) In addition to other powers granted to the 5 trustees of the University of Wyoming, the board may offer 6 and provide at other institutions, universities or 7 colleges, a course of training and education in the field 8 of dentistry.

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10 (b) To accomplish the purposes of this section, the 11 board of trustees may enter into contracts with other 12 institutions, universities or colleges outside the state 13 that maintain schools for the training and education of 14 students in dentistry and to expend funds appropriated for 15 this purpose in connection therewith.

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17 (C) Students desiring to avail themselves of the opportunities under this section, before enrolling for such 18 courses and having completed the admissions process into 19 20 the dental education program at a school of dentistry with 21 which the university has an agreement under subsection (a) 22 of this section, must be approved by the president of the 23 university acting with the advice of the state board of dentistry. No student shall be approved by the president 24

unless the student or the student's father, mother or 1 2 lawful guardian are residents of Wyoming and have been 3 residents for not less than five (5) years immediately 4 prior thereto. 5 In addition to the requirements of subsection (c) 6 (d) 7 of this section, before expending any funds the board of 8 trustees shall obtain an agreement from each student 9 whereby the student agrees to: 10 11 (i) Authorize the state of Wyoming to pay the 12 costs of education incurred in his dentistry education as 13 determined by any contract between the state of Wyoming and 14 the school of dentistry providing that education; and 15 16 (A) Actively engage in professional practice or other professional pursuits in dentistry in 17 Wyoming for such period as the board requires, which period 18 19 shall not exceed three (3) years; or 20 21 Repay all amounts expended by the state (B) 22 of Wyoming under this paragraph on the student's education, together with interest which shall begin accruing after the 23 24 student's graduation, but in no event later than five (5)

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1 years after the student enters into an agreement, upon 2 terms specified by the board. However, interest shall 3 begin to accrue if the board finds that the student has 4 withdrawn from the school of dentistry or is otherwise not 5 making satisfactory progress toward completion of the degree or program. Money expended under this paragraph 6 7 shall accrue interest at an annual rate equal to that charged for federal Stafford loans at the time interest 8 9 begins to accrue, which rate shall be adjusted annually to match the federal Stafford loan rate. In no event shall 10 11 the interest rate be greater than eight percent (8%).

13 (ii) In exchange for a reduction in the time required to practice under subparagraph (i) (A) of this 14 subsection or for other incentives specified in the 15 contract, treat Wyoming patients eligible for services 16 17 under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act under terms and conditions specified in the agreement. All 18 contract provisions established under this paragraph shall 19 20 be developed in consultation with the state board of 21 dentistry and the department of health.

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(e) Upon recommendation of the president of theuniversity, the board of trustees may relieve a student of

1 the obligation to repay amounts expended under paragraph 2 (d)(i) of this section, in whole or in part, where 3 repayment would cause undue hardship. The university shall 4 annually report the number of students relieved from 5 repayment under this subsection to the joint labor, health and social services interim committee not later than 6 7 October 1.

9 Any amounts paid by dentistry students (f) in 10 accordance with the contractual arrangements authorized 11 under this section shall be deposited into a special 12 account designated the Dentistry School Student Account, 13 maintained and separately accounted for by the University of Wyoming, which account may be added to by specific 14 contributions from other sources. The account may be 15 16 invested, at the discretion of the president of the 17 University of Wyoming, for the production of income. The investment income shall be expended by the University of 18 Wyoming for assistance and scholarships to dentistry 19 students as authorized by the president of the University 20 21 of Wyoming and the dean of the college of health sciences. 22 The principal of the fund established shall remain unimpaired and only the income derived therefrom may be 23 24 collected and expended from year to year. On or before

October 1 of each year, the university shall submit a 1 report to the joint labor, health and social services 2 3 interim committee on income to the fund and expenditures 4 from fund earnings during the prior fiscal year.

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Section 2. (a) The University of Wyoming shall, in 6 7 consultation with the Wyoming board of dentistry and Wyoming professional dental organizations, enter into 8 9 negotiations with schools of dentistry at Creighton 10 University, the University of Nebraska, and if feasible, 11 other schools of dentistry to pay the cost of education for 12 not to exceed a total of ten (10) seats annually in each 13 class year of dental students under the program created by this act. Thus, when all class levels are full, the 14 program would have a maximum of forty (40) students. The 15 University of Wyoming shall pursue establishing the program 16 17 to the extent feasible for the fall 2007 entering classes. By October 1, 2007, the university shall provide a progress 18 report to the joint labor, health and social services 19 20 interim committee regarding the implementation of this act. 21

22 (b) There is appropriated from the general fund to the University of Wyoming five hundred thousand dollars 23 24 (\$500,000.00), or as much thereof as is necessary, for the

fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, to implement this act, 1 2 including expenses related to contract negotiations with 3 dental schools, contract administration, and recruitment of 4 undergraduates into the dental profession. These funds 5 shall be included in the university's 167 medical education budget and not in its block grant. Unexpended and obligated 6 7 funds appropriated under this section shall not revert at the end of the biennium and shall be used exclusively for 8 9 the program created by this act during the biennium commencing July 1, 2008. 10

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12 This act is immediately effective upon Section 3. completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 14 Wyoming 15 Constitution.
