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AN ACT relating to insurance; prohibiting clauses in
    insurance policies excluding coverage for losses caused by
    the insured's receipt of experimental treatment as
    specified; providing a definition; providing an exception;
    and providing for an effective date.
    Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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    Section 1. W.S. 26-15-137 is created to read:
    26-15-137. Experimental treatment exclusion clauses;
    prohibition.
(a) No policy or certificate of insurance that is delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed in this state after June 30, 2007, including those issued by a health
maintenance organization authorized pursuant to chapter 34 of this title, shall exclude the payment of benefits incurred because the medical treatment of the insured or certificate holder is determined to be experimental treatment or treatment given in the course of a clinical trial.
(b) For purposes of this section, "experimental treatment or treatment given in the course of a clinical trial" means treatment that is not commonly used for a particular condition or illness but that is recognized as a scientifically valid subject for research in the treatment of the particular condition or illness and there is no clearly superior, nonexperimental treatment alternative available to the insured or certificate holder.
(c) Nothing in this section precludes an insurer from excluding coverage for any claim arising from the practice of medicine or other health care by a person without an applicable physician or health care provider license.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2007.
