Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
Section 1. W.S. 23-6-206(a)(intro), (b), by creating
a new subsection (c) and by renumbering (c) as (d) is
amended to read:
23-6-206. Revocation of license; hunting after

suspended license.

The court may, in its discretion, revoke any 1 (a) 2 license issued under this act to any person convicted of a

3 violation of this act, for the remainder of the year in

4 which the conviction occurs, and except for conviction of a

5 10th or 11th degree misdemeanor, may suspend the person's

privilege to purchase or receive any other license under 6

this act, or to take any wildlife for the following time 7

8 periods:

10 (b) No person whose license has been forfeited or privilege to purchase another license suspended shall 11 procure, purchase, or possess another license during the 12 13 period of forfeiture or suspension. If the person 14 procures, purchases, or possesses another license during such period, the license is invalid and that person is not 15 entitled to receive another license for the year up to six 16 (6) years next succeeding the year in which a conviction of 17 a violation of this subsection occurs original revocation 18 19 or suspension period. Violation of this subsection

constitutes a 9th 5th degree misdemeanor.

(c) No person whose license has been forfeited or privilege to purchase another license suspended shall take any wildlife prohibited by the court during the period of

1	forfeiture or suspension. If the person takes any wildlife
2	prohibited by the court during such period, that person is
3	not entitled to receive another license for up to six (6)
4	years next succeeding the original revocation or suspension
5	period. Violation of this subsection constitutes a 5th
6	degree misdemeanor.
7	
8	(c) (d) "Conviction" means a determination of guilt by
9	any Wyoming court having legal jurisdiction of the offense
10	from which no appeal is legally perfected. Pleas of nolo
11	contendere and forfeitures of bail shall be deemed
12	convictions for the purposes of this act.

14	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2007.
