## A BILL

## for

1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; authorizing funding for 2 certain programs; providing an appropriation; specifying 3 legislative intent; requiring a report; and providing for 4 an effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 7

8 Section 1. The legislature finds that a number of 9 programs managed by the game and fish commission are of 10 benefit to the citizens of the state of Wyoming whether or 11 not those citizens hunt and fish. Historically, funding for wildlife conservation has been almost totally dependent 12 on user fees from hunters and anglers. The intent of this 13 act is to provide general funding for programs managed by 14 the game and fish commission that benefit the population in 15 16 general.

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1 2 Section 2. 3 4 (a) The game and fish commission shall maintain the 5 programs specified in this section. The programs to be maintained under this act, in such manner as determined to 6 7 be best by the commission are: 8 9 (i) Sensitive species programs: The programs 10 include management of terrestrial native non-game species, aquatic native nongame species and trophy game conflict 11 12 resolution; 13 14 (ii) Habitat programs: The programs include aquatic habitat management, habitat extension 15 and 16 terrestrial habitat management; 17 18 (iii) Conservation education programs: The programs include publications and education, excluding 19 20 hunter education; 21 22 (iv) General programs: The programs include cost allocation which consists of costs that are a result 23 of services provided to the commission by other entities in 24

1 state government as required by state law and costs for use 2 of the state agency law enforcement communications system; 3

4 (V) Sage grouse conservation: This program 5 includes continued funding for sage grouse planning and protection; 6

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(vi) Veterinary services programs: 8 This 9 includes continued funding for brucellosis, chronic wasting 10 disease and other disease management.

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12 Section 3. There is appropriated from the general 13 fund to an earmarked account within the game and fish fund, hundred sixty thousand dollars 14 seven million six (\$7,660,000.00) or as much thereof as is necessary for 15 purposes of this act. The commission shall not expend more 16 17 than fifty percent (50%) of this appropriation on any single program specified in section 2 of this act. 18

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20 Section 4. The commission shall report to the joint 21 travel, recreation, wildlife and cultural resources interim 22 committee not later than December 1, 2007 regarding expenditures under this act. The report shall contain a 23 24 summary of expenditures for programs under this act and
