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1 2 (ii) Truck traffic growth along I-80 is increasing even faster than passenger vehicle traffic 3 4 growth, with truck volume expected to double by the year 5 2020; 6 7 (iii) Costs to maintain I-80 will be high, with significant safety, congestion, environmental and social 8 9 disruption; 10 11 (iv) Limited rail capacity through Wyoming is a 12 national problem that results in more freight traversing I-13 80; 14 15 (v) Continuation of current amounts of funding 16 will be insufficient to meet construction and maintenance 17 costs for I-80; 18 19 (vi) The current budget review process appears to 20 inadequate to assess the increasing costs and to be 21 determine an accurate forecast for budgetary planning for 22 highway construction; 23

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1 (vii) A joint legislative-executive committee will assist the legislative and executive branches in long 2 3 term construction planning and budgeting for anticipated 4 freight traffic increases across Wyoming. 5 There is appropriated from the general fund to 6 (b) the legislative service office one hundred thousand dollars 7 (\$100,000.00), effective immediately, to be used to 8 9 establish and support through December 31, 2007, a joint 10 legislative-executive committee to review the issues 11 related to the I-80 traffic increases. 12 13 (c) The committee shall consist of nine (9) members, 14 including: 15 16 (i) Three (3) members of the Wyoming house of 17 representatives, with not more than two (2) members from the same political party. The members shall be appointed 18 by the speaker of the house, who shall also appoint one (1) 19 20 of the members as cochairman of the committee. One (1) 21 member each shall be from: 22 23 The house transportation, highways and (A) 24 military affairs committee;

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4	(ii) Three (3) members of the Wyoming senate,

1 2 3 (C) One (1) member who is employed in the 4 governor's office. 5 6 (d) Members of the task force shall be paid as 7 follows: 8 9 (i) Legislative members of the committee shall be paid salary, per diem and travel expenses as provided in 10 11 W.S. 28-5-101 for their official duties as members of the 12 committee; 13 14 (ii) State employees serving on the task force 15 shall receive no additional compensation for serving on the task force, but shall be paid as provided in W.S. 9-3-102 16 17 and 9-3-103 for travel and per diem expenses incurred for their official duties as members of the task force; 18 19 20 (iii) All other members of the task force shall 21 be paid as provided in W.S. 9-3-102 and 9-3-103 for travel 22 and per diem expenses incurred for their official duties as members of the task force. 23 24

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1 (e) State agencies shall provide information and 2 other support to the committee as requested. The 3 legislative service office shall staff the committee. The 4 committee shall meet as often as necessary and shall report 5 with recommendations to the joint transportation, highways and military affairs interim committee and the joint 6 7 appropriations interim committee not later than October 15, 2007. 8 9 10 (f) The committee shall conduct a comprehensive 11 review of the I-80 traffic issues, including but not 12 limited to a review of: 13 14 (i) Current and projected traffic levels, especially truck traffic, with evidence-based projections 15 16 through the year 2025; 17 (ii) The traffic carrying capacity of I-80 as it 18 currently exists, if selected sections were widened to six 19 20 (6) lanes and if the entire highway were widened to six (6) 21 lanes; 22 23 (iii) A cost comparison of reconstructing the 24 highway using different methods of highway paving;

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1 2 (iv) Currently available and anticipated 3 intelligent traffic control devices to promote the flow of 4 traffic, including a cost benefit analysis of such devices; 5 6 The practicality and projected cost (v) of 7 building additional freight railroad lines along the I-80 corridor that would have the capability of carrying freight 8 9 tractors and trailers across Wyoming; 10 11 (vi) An analysis of possible funding sources for 12 highway and railroad improvements recommended as a result 13 of the committee's analysis; 14 (vii) Any other matters the committee considers 15 16 relevant. 17 18 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 19 20 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 21 Constitution. 22 23 (END)
