- 1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; authorizing funding for
- 2 certain programs; providing an appropriation; specifying
- 3 legislative intent; requiring a report; and providing for

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

7

- 8 **Section 1.** The legislature finds that a number of
- 9 programs managed by the game and fish commission are of
- 10 benefit to the citizens of the state of Wyoming whether or
- 11 not those citizens hunt and fish. Historically, funding
- 12 for wildlife conservation has been almost totally dependent
- 13 on user fees from hunters and anglers. The intent of this
- 14 act is to provide general funding for programs managed by
- 15 the game and fish commission that benefit the population in
- 16 general.

2 Section 2.

4 (a) The game and fish commission shall maintain the

5 programs specified in this section. The programs to be

6 maintained under this act, in such manner as determined to

7 be best by the commission are:

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9 (i) Sensitive species programs: The programs

10 include management of terrestrial native nongame species,

11 aquatic native nongame species and trophy game conflict

12 resolution;

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14 (ii) Habitat programs: The programs include

15 aquatic habitat management, habitat extension and

16 terrestrial habitat management;

18 (iii) Conservation education programs: The

19 programs include publications and education, excluding

20 hunter education;

22 (iv) General programs: The programs include

23 cost allocation which consists of costs that are a result

24 of services provided to the commission by other entities in

1 state government as required by state law and costs for use

2 of the state agency law enforcement communications system;

4 (v) Sage grouse conservation: This program

5 includes continued funding for sage grouse planning and

6 protection;

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8 (vi) Veterinary services programs: This

9 includes continued funding for brucellosis, chronic wasting

10 disease and other disease management.

11

12 (b) No funds appropriated from the general fund for

13 programs under subsection (a) of this section shall be

14 expended for the acquisition of fee simple title in real

15 estate.

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17 **Section 3.** There is appropriated from the general

18 fund to an earmarked account within the game and fish fund,

19 two million eight hundred thirty thousand dollars

20 (\$2,830,000.00) for the period beginning July 1, 2007 and

21 ending June 30, 2008. The state auditor shall transfer the

22 appropriation in this section to the Wyoming game and fish

23 fund as created by W.S. 23-1-501 on the effective date of

24 this act. Funds transferred under this act that remain

1 unencumbered or unobligated as of June 30, 2008 shall

2 revert to the budget reserve account. The commission shall

3 not expend more than fifty percent (50%) of this

4 appropriation on any single program specified in section 2

5 of this act.

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7 Section 4. The commission shall report to the joint

travel, recreation, wildlife and cultural resources interim 8

9 committee not later than December 1, 2007 regarding

10 expenditures under this act. The report shall contain a

11 summary of expenditures for programs under this act and

12 identification of additional funding needs in the areas

identified under section 2 of this act or other areas the 13

14 commission deems appropriate as potential areas for general

15 funding.

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Section 5. This act is effective July 1, 2007. 17
