for 1 ACT relating to courts; authorizing a judicial 2 sabbatical program; providing for program administration; establishing an account; providing for assignments for 3 4 absent circuit judges generally; providing an appropriation and providing for a continuous appropriation; and providing 5 6 for an effective date. 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 5-2-601 is created to read: 10 11 12 ARTICLE 6 13 JUDICIAL SABBATICALS

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5-2-601. Judicial sabbatical program; account setablished; program operation.

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1 (a) There is established a judicial sabbatical 2 program account to be administered by the supreme court in 3 accordance with the provisions of this section. Monies in 4 the account are continuously appropriated to the supreme 5 court and may be expended by the supreme court for salaries, benefits and expenses of active or retired judges 6 7 assigned to perform the duties of a judge granted a sabbatical under a program adopted by rule of the supreme 8 9 court, if the program complies with the provisions of this 10 section. Notwithstanding W.S. 5-3-108, 5-3-109 11 5-9-119, salaries, benefits and expenses of judges assigned to act for a judge granted a sabbatical pursuant to this 12 13 section shall be paid from the judicial sabbatical program 14 account. Appropriations to the account shall not lapse at 15 the end of any fiscal period. Any unexpended balance in the account shall be invested by the state treasurer and the 16

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19 (b) The supreme court by rule may implement a 20 judicial sabbatical program which:

interest earned shall be credited to the account.

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22 (i) Is designed to promote improved access, 23 efficiency and effectiveness in the judicial system;

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1 (ii) Authorizes paid or unpaid sabbaticals only 2 to circuit court judges, district court judges and supreme 3 court justices who: 4 5 (A) Immediately prior to being granted a sabbatical, have served at least seven (7) consecutive 6 years as a Wyoming circuit or district court judge or 7 supreme court justice. The required seven (7) years need 8 9 not have been served in the same position; and 10 11 Subject to applicable (B) election 12 retention requirements, agree to serve at least three (3) 13 years as a Wyoming circuit court or district court judge or 14 supreme court justice and to repay any paid sabbatical if 15 he breaches that agreement. 16 17 (iii) Authorizes a paid sabbatical for 18 individual for not more than a period of one hundred twenty 19 (120) days and for not more than one (1) time in any eight 20 (8) year period; 21 22 (iv) Restricts paid sabbaticals in accordance with available funds in the judicial sabbatical 23 program 24 account.

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2 (c) Any judge or justice granted a paid sabbatical
3 pursuant to this section shall be deemed to have rendered
4 services to the state during the authorized sabbatical
5 period and shall be entitled to full salary and related
6 benefits authorized by law.

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8 (d) Any paid sabbatical authorized under this section 9 shall be subject to constitutional and statutory provisions 10 concerning when salary increases can become effective.

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12 **Section 2.** W.S. 5-3-107 and 5-9-119(b) are amended 13 to read:

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5-3-107. Assignment of acting or retired judge to another district in case of death or other emergency.

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If any judge of any district court in this state shall die,
or for any reason become unwilling or unable to perform the
duties of his office, or be granted a sabbatical in
accordance with W.S. 5-2-601, the chief justice of the
supreme court of the state of Wyoming, by order to be duly
entered in the records of the district court of each county
in such district, may assign any district judge or any

1 retired judge of this state, to perform any and all

2 judicial functions therein, until the judge returns to duty

3 or a successor for such district shall have been appointed

4 or elected and qualified according to law, and such

5 assigned judge shall have the same jurisdiction and

6 authority in such district as a duly elected and qualified

7 judge of such district.

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9 5-9-119. Judges may hold court for each other;

10 expenses of judge holding court in another circuit or

11 district; disqualification of judge; change of venue

12 **prohibited.**

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14 (b) A party to any action in circuit court may

15 disqualify a circuit judge as provided by rules adopted by

16 the supreme court for disqualification. Upon

17 disqualification, or inability for any reason to fulfill

18 his duties, the circuit judge shall appoint another circuit

19 judge from his own or a different circuit or a district

20 judge from his own or a different district, or a magistrate

21 from the county in which the case is to be tried if no

22 other circuit judge is available, to try the action. If a

23 circuit court judge is granted a sabbatical in accordance

24 with W.S. 5-2-601, or for any reason is unwilling or unable

1 to perform the duties of his office, the chief justice of 2 the supreme court of the state of Wyoming, by order to be 3 duly entered in the records of the circuit court of each 4 county served by that circuit court, may assign any 5 circuit court judge or any retired judge of this state, to perform any and all judicial functions therein, until the 6 7 judge returns to duty. 8 9 Section 3. There is appropriated to the judicial sabbatical program account from the general fund 10 hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00). 11 12 13 **Section 4.** This act is effective July 1, 2007. 14 15 (END)
