1 AN ACT relating to administration of the government; 2 creating the capitol complex energy efficiency program; 3 providing for the use of energy efficient measures in state 4 buildings as specified; providing reporting requirements; 5 providing an appropriation; providing for a position; and 6 providing for an effective date. 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 Section 1. W.S. 9-2-1035 through 9-2-1040 are created 10 to read: 11 12 13 9-2-1035. Short title. 14 15 This act may be cited as the "Capitol Complex Energy 16 Efficiency Program".

1 2 9-2-1036. Definitions. 3 4 (a) As used in this act: 5 6 (i) "Capitol complex building" means any 7 building, structure, or other improvement that is 8 constructed on property owned by the state, any department 9 of the state or its divisions, commissions, institutions or agencies within eight (8) city blocks of the capitol 10 11 building. "Capitol complex building" does not include: 12 13 (A) An unoccupied structure that is a 14 component of the state highway system; or 15 (B) A privately owned structure that is 16 17 located on property owned by the state, its divisions, 18 commissions, institutions or agencies. 19 20 (ii) "Cost" means the expenses related to planning, design, construction and installation of energy 21 22 efficiency measures and any administrative expenses of the 23 division incurred in the performance of its duties under the 24 capitol complex energy efficiency program; 25

(iii) "Division" means the general services 1 2 division of the department of administration and 3 information; 4 (iv) "Energy efficiency measures" means actions 5 6 taken or initiated by a state agency that reduce the state 7 agency's energy use, increase the state agency's energy efficiency, reduce source energy consumption, reduce water 8 9 consumption or lower the costs of energy or water to the 10 state agency; 11 (v) "Manager" means the energy efficiency program 12 13 manager within the division. 14 15 (vi) "This act" means W.S. 9-2-1035 through 16 9-2-1040. 17 9-2-1037. Capitol complex building efficiency 18 19 program. 20 21 (a) Each state agency occupying a capitol complex 22 building shall: 23 24 (i) Submit to the division, on forms provided by the division, a list of facilities in the capitol complex 25 area operated by that agency that have a potential for 26

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1 energy savings, based on age, energy use, function and 2 condition of the building; 3 4 (ii) Designate a staff member that is responsible 5 for coordinating energy efficiency efforts within the 6 agency; 7 8 (iii) Provide energy consumption and costs 9 information to the division on a monthly basis; 10 11 (iv) Develop strategies for improving energy 12 efficiency and reducing energy costs by utilizing renewable 13 or alternative energy resources when practicable and 14 procuring and using energy efficient products when 15 practicable; and 16 with information 17 (v) Provide the division 18 regarding the agency's energy efficiency and reduction 19 strategies as well as the net effect of the strategies on 20 energy consumption and costs. 21 22 (b) Based on the information submitted to the division 23 pursuant to paragraph (a)(i) of this section, the division 24 shall select certain facilities for further energy analysis to identify the technical and financial feasibility of 25 26 making energy conservation improvements to the facilities. 27

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9-2-1038. Reporting requirements. The division, through its energy efficiency (a) program manager and as outlined in W.S. 9-2-1040 shall report to the governor and joint appropriations interim committee of the legislature and state building commission on or before October 15 of each year. (b) Each facility manager of a capitol complex building shall report to the division on or before June 15 of each year and provide proof of the efforts made to conserve energy at the building as evidenced by: (i) Education programs and incentives for staff participation; (ii) Energy usage records showing reductions and related weather information; (iii) Records of recycled product use and the estimated cost-savings realized; (iv) Replacement of equipment with higher efficiency ratings and the estimated cost-savings realized; Landscaping modifications (v) for energy reduction; or

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(vi) Comparable measurable efforts.

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9-2-1039. Energy consumption council.

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An energy consumption council shall meet periodically with 6 7 the division in prioritizing the division to assist 8 opportunities to reduce energy consumption in capitol 9 complex buildings. The council shall consist of five (5) to 10 seven (7) members. The council shall advocate to state 11 agencies methods to reduce energy consumption. The members 12 shall be comprised of individuals who are the designated 13 staff members from their respective agencies who are 14 responsible for coordinating their agency's efforts 15 regarding energy efficiency. The members of the council shall be appointed by the governor and shall receive no 16 17 additional compensation for serving as a member of the 18 council.

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9-2-1040. Duties of the general services division of
the department of administration and information.

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23 (a) The division may:

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1 (i) Analyze state utility data to identify high 2 potential energy efficiency opportunities in capitol complex 3 buildings; 4 5 (ii) Perform comprehensive energy analysis on 6 capitol complex buildings, structures and facilities; 7 (iii) Train facility maintenance staff in energy 8 9 saving techniques and maintenance of energy improvements, 10 and monitor energy conservation efforts by state agencies located in capitol complex buildings. 11 12 13 (b) The division shall employ an energy efficiency program manager to coordinate the duties of the division 14 under this act. The manager shall compile monthly reports 15 16 showing efforts and effects of efforts to reduce energy 17 consumption in capitol complex buildings. 18 19 The department of administration and information (C) 20 shall have authority to promulgate any rules and regulations 21 necessary to implement and administer this act. 22 23 Section **2**. W.S. 9-2-1016(b) by creating а new 24 paragraph (xxiii) is amended to read: 25 9-2-1016. General services division. 26 27

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(b) For the purpose of this subsection the term 1 2 "agencies" does not include the University of Wyoming, 3 community college districts, or school districts. It does 4 not include the department of transportation except as to paragraphs (xi), (xii) and (xiii) of this subsection. 5 The 6 department through the general services division shall: 7 (xxiii) Administer the capitol complex building 8 9 energy efficiency program pursuant to the duties specified 10 in W.S. 9-2-1040. 11 12 Section 3. 13 14 (a) Ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000.00) is 15 appropriated from the general fund to the department of 16 administration and information for the purpose of this act 17 for the fiscal biennium ending June 30, 2008. 18 19 (b) One (1) additional full-time position is 20 authorized for the division of administration and 21 information to implement and coordinate the capitol complex 22 building energy efficiency program. This position is time 23 limited and shall be terminated on June 30, 2010. 24

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Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon 1 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as 2 3 4, Section 8 of provided by Article the Wyoming 4 Constitution. 5
