A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to licensing and operation of nursing care facilities; authorizing an alternative eldercare long term 2 3 care pilot program; amending a definition; granting rulemaking authority; providing an appropriation; 4 and 5 providing for an effective date. 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 Section 1. W.S. 35-2-913 is created to read: 10 11 35-2-913. Alternative eldercare home pilot program 12 authorized. 13 (a) The legislature finds that a public good is 14 served by the development of housing and care facilities 15 16 that serve members of the elder population who are unable

1 to care for themselves in their own homes and who wish to 2 live with dignity and enjoyment and a level of care 3 necessary to support their needs.

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5 (b) Five (5) regional pilot program grants are authorized to study and verify the feasibility of long term 6 care through alternative eldercare homes. Each grant shall 7 be awarded by the department to communities which wish to 8 9 survey their area for needs and develop a plan for 10 providing alternative eldercare in the area. The 11 department shall distribute grants among the applicants in 12 a manner which will best determine in a timely manner the 13 effectiveness of the alternative eldercare approach to long 14 term care of the elderly.

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16 (c) Each grant proposal shall include a requirement 17 for a local match of twenty-five percent (25%) of the grant 18 amount.

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20 (d) For communities that have completed a needs 21 study, the grant funding may be used for design and 22 development of the facility and the organization which will 23 operate the facility.

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1 (e) The department shall work with local communities 2 in the development of rules and regulations which are 3 compatible with the culture of the homes and which will 4 assure appropriate licensure for the care provided and the 5 needs of the elder residents. 6 The department shall distribute grants among the 7 (f) grantees in a manner which will best facilitate the pilot 8 9 projects and determine the effectiveness of this approach 10 to elder care in a timely manner. 11 (g) As a condition of receiving the grants, each 12 13 grantee shall: 14 15 (i) Agree to provide training and reports to other parties in the state interested in the alternative 16 17 eldercare concept; 18 19 (ii) Agree to and in fact accept patients 20 qualified under the Medical Assistance and Services Act, 21 Title XVIII of the federal Social Security Act, who seek 22 care which the facility is qualified to provide. 23

24 (h) For purposes of this section:

1 2 (i) "Alternative eldercare home" means а 3 facility and program which: 4 5 (A) Provides housing to no more than ten (10) residents per house at the same time; 6 7 (B) Provides services and care 8 at the 9 highest level required by a resident and as permitted under 10 the applicable facility; 11 12 (C) Shall be licensed as a health care 13 facility pursuant to W.S. 35-2-901(a)(x); 14 15 (D) Creates environments that allow long-16 term residents to develop lasting relationships with other residents and staff; 17 18 19 Maintains residences (E) units as 20 independent from each other and from other facilities such 21 that there is no physical connection or shared roof 22 structures between houses; 23

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1 (F) Provides, at a minimum, a private 2 bedroom and full bath for each resident; 3 4 (G) Provides services to Medicaid supported 5 residents at the Medicaid reimbursement rates; 6 7 (H) Provides a secured exterior patio or garden with covered seating for each house accessible by 8 9 all residents including those with wheelchairs and 10 assistive devices; 11 12 (J) Maintains all common spaces within the 13 house, including secured exterior space, accessible and 14 open to all residents during waking hours; 15 16 (K) Provides for locked storage of 17 hazardous materials and control of kitchen access during 18 high traffic periods of meal preparation and clean-up; 19 20 (M) Provides an office within each house 21 for use as a nurses' station; 22 23 (N) Provides a common area in each house 24 including a seating area;

1 2 (O) Provides in a den each house to 3 accommodate television viewing and limited overnight 4 guests; 5 6 (P) Provides public and staff bathroom 7 facilities; 8 9 (Q) Creates a residential home environment 10 in all aspects, using residential materials and designs 11 appropriate to the style of the neighborhood; 12 13 (R) Implements a self-managed work team approach to in-house and clinical support staffing. 14 Each house shall have its own core in-house staffing that is 15 16 specific and dedicated to a single house; 17 18 Provides workspace for clinical support (S) 19 team members in a building separate from the house; 20 21 (T) Is fully committed to a restraint free environment; 22 23

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1 (U) Maintains a lift free environment by 2 providing ceiling lifts in each resident's bedroom and 3 bathroom; 4 5 (W) Implements a culture of learning and participation by the residents and honors the elderhood 6 7 stage of life. 8 9 (ii) "Community" means a city, town or county. 10 Section 2. W.S. 35-2-901(a)(xxiv) is amended to read: 11 12 13 35-2-901. Definitions; applicability of provisions. 14 (a) As used in this act: 15 16 17 (xxiv) "This act" means W.S. 35-2-901 through 18 35 2 912 35-2-913. 19 Section 3. For purposes of the alternative eldercare 20 21 grant program created by this act, there is appropriated to 22 the department of health from the general fund two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) for the fiscal biennium 23 ending June 30, 2008. 24
