## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Mental Health Professions Practice
- 2 Act; modifying certification and provisional licensing
- 3 requirements; clarifying licensure and certification
- 4 reciprocity; expanding elements of prohibited sexual
- 5 exploitation; and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-38-106(b)(intro), (c)(intro),
- 10 (d)(i), by creating a new paragraph (iii), by renumbering
- 11 (iii) as (iv), by amending and renumbering (iv) as (v), by
- 12 renumbering (v) as (vi), (n)(intro) and by creating a new
- 13 paragraph (vi), 33-38-108 and 33-38-110(c)(x) are amended
- 14 to read:

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- 16 33-38-106. Requirements for licensure and
- 17 certification.

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2 Certification under this subsection shall allow (b) 3 practice as a certified social worker only under the 4 supervision of a qualified clinical supervisor and subject 5 to any other restrictions which may be specified by the board. The board shall grant certification as a certified 6 7 social worker to any applicant who files an application upon a form and in the manner prescribed by the board, 8 accompanied by the appropriate fee and who furnishes 9 10 satisfactory evidence to the board of the following:

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practice as a certified addictions practitioner only under the supervision of a qualified clinical supervisor and subject to any other restrictions which may be specified by the board. The board shall grant certification as a certified addictions practitioner to any applicant who files an application upon a form and in the manner prescribed by the board, accompanied by the appropriate fee and who furnishes satisfactory evidence to the board of the following:

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23 (d) Provisional licensure is a means to continue 24 progress towards satisfactory completion of all licensure

1 requirements under this act. Upon review and approval by 2 the designated board member or board, the board shall issue 3 a provisional license to any applicant who files 4 application upon a form and in the manner prescribed by the 5 board, accompanied by the appropriate fee and who furnishes 6 satisfactory evidence to the board of the following: 7 The applicant has satisfied all requirements 8 (i) 9 for licensure other than the requirements for examination 10 and completion of the required hours of supervised clinical 11 experience reached the age of majority; 12 13 (iii) The applicant meets one (1) 14 following educational requirements: 15 16 (A) Holds a master's or doctorate degree in 17 one (1) of the disciplines identified from an accredited program and institution of higher education which is 18 19 professional in content and which meets the academic and 20 training content standards established by the board; or 21 22 (B) Holds a master's or doctorate degree 23 which is clinical in content from a regionally accredited 24 institution of higher education in one (1)of

1	disciplines identified. During the term of provisional
2	licensure under this subsection, the applicant shall
3	complete any program deficiencies required to meet the
4	academic and training content standards established by the
5	board; or
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7	(C) Holds a license for independent
8	clinical practice in good standing in the identified
9	discipline for another licensing jurisdiction which does
10	not meet the criteria for reciprocal licensure under this
11	act. During the term of provisional licensure under this
12	subsection, the applicant shall complete any program
13	deficiencies required to meet the academic and training
14	content standards established by the board.
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16	(iii) (iv) The provisional licensed professional
17	counselor, clinical social worker, marriage and family
18	therapist and addictions therapist shall be allowed to
19	practice only under the supervision of a qualified clinical
20	supervisor and in accordance with any other restrictions
21	specified by the board;
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23	(iv) (v) Unless extended, the provisional license

24 shall expire thirty-six (36) months after issuance or upon

receipt by the board of the applicant's passing examination 1

2 results, and completion of the required hours of

3 supervision whichever occurs first issuance of a license

4 under this act by the board;

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(v) (vi) The board may, for good cause shown, 6

7 grant an extension of a provisional license subject to any

additional restrictions specified by the board. 8

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(n) Certification under this subsection shall allow 10

11 practice as a certified addictions practitioner assistant

12 only under the supervision of a qualified clinical

supervisor and subject to any other restrictions which may 13

14 be specified by the board. The board shall grant

certification as a certified addictions practitioner 15

assistant to any applicant who files an application upon a 16

17 form and in the manner prescribed by the board, accompanied

by the appropriate fee and who furnishes satisfactory 18

evidence to the board of the following: 19

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21 (vi) Unless extended, the applicant has six (6)

22 months from the date of employment to become certified.

23 The board may for good cause grant an extension of this

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24 period.

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33-38-108. Reciprocity.

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4 (a) The board may issue a license or certification by 5 endorsement Any individual holding a license in good standing to engage in the practice of professional 6 7 counseling, clinical social work, social work, marriage and family therapy and addictions therapy and treatment to any 8 9 applicant who has a license or certificate in good standing 10 with no formal complaints or sanctions as a professional 11 counselor, a marriage and family therapist, a clinical social worker, under the laws of another state having 12 13 licensure requirements substantially similar to those 14 required by this act may upon approval of the board, be issued a license to practice in this state. 15

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(b) Any individual holding a certification in good standing to engage in the practice of social worker, mental health worker, addictions practitioner work or an addictions therapist therapy under the laws of another jurisdiction if the applicant presents proof satisfactory to the board that, at the time of application for a Wyoming license or state having certification by endorsement, the applicant possesses credentials and qualifications

1	requirements substantially comparable similar to those
2	required by this act as determined by may upon approval of
3	the board, be issued certification to practice in this

13	suspend, revoke or otherwise restrict licensure or
14	certification under this act for any of the following

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17	(x) Sexual exploitation as defined by the board,
18	of a <del>patient </del> client, former client or an individual
19	receiving services from any licensee or certificate holder
20	employed by the organization, defined as including:
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22	(A) Any <del>verbal</del> behavior by a licensee or

23 certificate holder under this <del>chapter act</del> which involves

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1	offers of exchange of professional services for some form
2	of sexual gratification; or
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4	(B) Unlawful or unprofessional sexual
5	contact or intimacies as defined by rule of the board, with
6	a client, former client or an individual receiving services
7	from any licensee or certificate holder employed by the
8	organization.
