Of this general fund appropriation, an amount not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) shall only be expended for purposes of defraying moving expenses for the agency director, division administrators and program managers who are required to move to Cheyenne. These funds shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation on June 30, 2008 shall revert to the budget reserve account. Not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) shall be expended for any one (1) employee. Any funds expended for this purpose shall be reimbursed to the state by the employee if the employee is employed by the state for less than twelve (12) months. No funds

shall be expended pursuant to this footnote unless approved by the governor.

2. The office of the chief information officer shall establish a working group of state government and private sector information technology professionals to examine the state of Wyoming's information technology services contract bidding process. The group shall develop recommendations for increasing Wyoming resident private information technology vendor participation in state information technology service contracts. The group shall report findings and recommendations to the governor and the joint appropriations interim committee not later than November 1, 2006.
