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15 (a) As used in this act:

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1 (xiii) "Medication assistant" means a certified 2 nursing assistant additionally trained and certified by the 3 board to administer oral, topical or transdermal 4 medications to residents or patients in health care 5 facilities excluding acute care facilities; 6 7  $\frac{\text{(xiii)}}{\text{(xiv)}}$  "This act" means W.S. 33-21-119 8 through 33-21-157. 9 33-21-122. Board of nursing; powers and duties. 10 11 12 (c) Without limiting the foregoing, the board of 13 nursing may do the following: 14 15 (xxiv) By board rule and regulation, regulate qualifications, certification, recertification, 16 the 17 examination and discipline of nursing assistants, and nurse aides and medication assistants. For purposes of carrying 18 out this paragraph, fingerprints and other information 19 20 necessary for a criminal history record background check 21 pursuant to W.S. 7-19-201 shall be provided to the board. 22 Section 2. The state board of nursing shall report to 23

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committee before November 1, 2007, regarding the progress 1 2 of the medication assistant program. 3 4 Section 3. 5 6 There is appropriated from the general fund to (a) 7 the state board of nursing for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008: 8 9 (i) Forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000.00) to 10 11 develop rules and regulations required by this act and to 12 implement initial licensing of medication assistants; 13 Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) 14 (ii) 15 develop recommendations for long-term funding of 16 continuing medication assistant licensing activities. 17 18 Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2007.
