The board shall grant 20 certification as a certified addictions practitioner assistant to any applicant who files an application upon a 21 22 form and in the manner prescribed by the board, accompanied

by the appropriate fee and who furnishes satisfactory 1 2 evidence to the board of the following: 3 (vi) Unless extended, the applicant has six (6) 4 5 months from the date of employment to become certified. 6 The board may for good cause grant an extension of this 7 period. 8 33-38-108. Reciprocity. 9 10 11 (a) The board may issue a license or certification by 12 endorsement Any individual holding a license in good 13 standing to engage in the practice of professional 14 counseling, clinical social work, social work, marriage and 15 family therapy and addictions therapy and treatment to any applicant who has a license or certificate in good standing 16 17 with no formal complaints or sanctions as a professional 18 counselor, a marriage and family therapist, a clinical 19 social worker, under the laws of another state having licensure requirements substantially similar to those 20 required by this act may, upon approval of the board, be 21 issued a license to practice in this state. 22
