1 (xi) "Injury" means any harmful change in the 2 human organism other than normal aging and includes damage 3 to or loss of any artificial replacement and death, arising out of and in the course of employment while at work in or 4 5 about the premises occupied, used or controlled by the employer and incurred while at work in places where the 6 7 employer's business requires an employee's presence and which subjects the employee to extrahazardous duties 8 9 incident to the business. "Injury" does not include:

11 (J) Any mental injury unless it is caused 12 by a compensable physical injury, it occurs subsequent to or simultaneously with, the physical injury and it is 13 14 established by clear and convincing evidence, which shall include a diagnosis by a licensed psychiatrist or licensed 15 16 clinical psychologist meeting criteria established in the 17 most recent edition of the diagnostic and statistical 18 manual of mental disorders published by the American 19 Psychiatric Association. In no event shall benefits for a compensable mental injury be paid for more than six (6) 20 21 months after an injured employee's physical injury has healed to the point that it is not reasonably expected to 22 23 substantially improve situation or condition arising out
