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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 41-2-112(a), (b)(v), by creating a
- 9 new paragraph (vii) and by renumbering paragraph (vii) as
- 10 (viii) and 41-2-122 by creating new subsection (d) are
- 11 amended to read:

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13 **41-2-112.** Wyoming water development program.

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(a) The Wyoming water development program is
established to foster, promote and encourage the optimal
development of the state's human, industrial, mineral,
agricultural, water and recreational resources. The
program shall provide, through the commission, procedures
and policies for the planning, selection, financing,
construction, acquisition and operation of projects and
facilities for the conservation, storage, distribution and
use of water, necessary in the public interest to develop
and preserve Wyoming's water and related land resources.
The program shall encourage development of new water
sources of supply and water facilities for irrigation, for
reduction of flood damage, for abatement of pollution, for
preservation and development of fish and wildlife resources
and for protection and improvement of public lands and
shall help make available the waters of this state for all
beneficial uses, including but not limited to municipal,
domestic, agricultural, industrial, instream flows,
hydroelectric power and recreational purposes, conservation
of land resources and protection of the health, safety and
general welfare of the people of the state of Wyoming.

1	(b) In developing financing recommendations under the
2	Wyoming water development program, the commission shall:
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4	(v) Consider all funds, assets and revenue
5	sources of all project beneficiaries and recommend
6	financing plans which will reimburse expenditures of state
7	funds, except as such expenditures may be allocated to a
8	state benefit, including development of a new water source
9	of supply and enhancement of fish and wildlife habitat or
10	recreation;
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12	(vii) Consider the development of a new water
13	source of supply to benefit the state of Wyoming;
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15	(vii) (viii) Consider any other factors necessary
16	to develop comprehensive financing recommendations.
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18	41-2-122. Protection and rights of landowner;
19	watercourse restoration.
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21	(d) The commission shall, upon application by a
22	sponsoring entity regarding land that will be flooded by
23	the development of a new water source of supply, restore

1	the natural carrying capacity of the channel when a new
2	water source of supply enters a watercourse with
3	intermittent or ephemeral natural flow and exceeds the
4	carrying capacity of a reach. The commission shall not
5	require a Level I reconnaissance study or spend more than
6	ten percent (10%) of the cost of the watercourse
7	restoration project on planning. Restoration of the
8	natural carrying capacity of the channel in the reach shall
9	be deemed to mitigate any damages and disruption of the
10	landowner's operations resulting from development of the
11	new water source of supply.
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13	Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon
14	completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
15	as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
16	Constitution.
