A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to agriculture and animals; modifying the 2 brucellosis surveillance program to provide for spaying heifers; and providing for an effective date. 3 4 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 5 6 7 Section 1. W.S. 11-19-407 is amended to read: 8 9 11-19-407. Brucellosis surveillance program. 10 (a) The livestock board shall develop a brucellosis 11 testing surveillance program which may be conducted with 12 13 the help of veterinary practitioners and livestock auction

14 markets. This program shall provide for the testing of

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livestock for brucellosis and for spaying heifers only to
 the extent that may be reasonably necessary to maintain the
 brucellosis-free status of the state of Wyoming.

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5 The compensation for brucellosis surveillance (b) 6 testing or spaying shall be paid at not less than three 7 dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50) per head and not more than eight dollars (\$8.00) per head of cattle actually tested or 8 9 Compensation for brucellosis testing and spaying spayed. 10 may include the purchase of brucellosis testing and spaying 11 equipment, supplies and postage.

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13 (C) Payments under subsection (b) of this section 14 shall be made monthly directly to accredited veterinarians 15 who perform brucellosis testing, spaying and surveillance planning or to livestock auction markets that use their 16 facilities and veterinarians to conduct brucellosis testing 17 18 and spaying as mandated by rule of the Wyoming livestock 19 board or the United States department of agriculture animal plant and health inspection service. The payment shall be 20 made upon submission to the Wyoming livestock board of a 21 22 notarized invoice indicating the number of head tested or

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- <u>spayed</u>, the ownership of the animals tested <u>or spayed</u> and
 the testing <u>or spaying</u> location.
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4 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 5 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 6 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 7 Constitution.
