A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to agriculture and animals; modifying the 2 brucellosis management program; providing for spaying of
- 3 heifers and other management practices; authorizing
- 4 rulemaking; providing an appropriation; and providing for
- 5 an effective date.

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- 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-19-407 is amended to read:
- 11 11-19-407. Brucellosis management program.

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(a) The livestock board shall develop a brucellosis 1 2 testing management program which may be conducted with the help of veterinary practitioners and livestock auction 3 markets. This program shall provide for the testing, 4 5 spaying of heifers and other management of livestock for brucellosis only to the extent that may be reasonably 6 7 necessary to maintain or to regain the brucellosis-free status of the state of Wyoming. 8

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The compensation for brucellosis surveillance 10 (b) 11 testing or spaying shall be paid at not less than three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50) per head and not more than 12 13 eight dollars (\$8.00) per head of cattle actually tested or 14 spayed. Compensation for brucellosis testing or spaying may include the purchase of brucellosis testing equipment, 15 16 supplies and postage.

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18 (c) Payments under subsection (b) of this section shall be made monthly directly to accredited veterinarians who perform brucellosis testing, spaying and surveillance planning or to livestock auction markets that use their 21 facilities and veterinarians to conduct brucellosis testing 22 as mandated by rule or spaying to comply with brucellosis 23

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1	rules of the Wyoming livestock board or the United States					
2	department of agriculture animal plant and health					
3	inspection service. The payment shall be made upon					
4	submission to the Wyoming livestock board of a notarized					
5	invoice indicating the number of head tested or spayed, the					
6	ownership of the animals tested or spayed and the testing					
7	location of the testing or spaying.

9	(d) In addition to payments under subsection (b) of					
10	this section, payments may be made directly to the owner of					
11	livestock for fencing, feed and other preventive activities					
12	undertaken for the purpose of keeping cattle separated from					
13	elk in areas of high brucellosis prevalence in elk,					
14	provided that such payments shall be made only when:					
15						
16	(i) The activity is undertaken to comply with a					
17	quarantine order of the Wyoming state veterinarian; or					
18						
19	(ii) The activity is pursuant to the terms of a					
20	livestock herd plan that has been entered into with the					
21	Wyoming state veterinarian.					
22	[Staff Note: Payments directly to an individual producer					

may raise constitutional issues unless a public benefit can

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1	be shown. The Attorney General's office will be submitting
2	a memorandum regarding the constitutional issue.]
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4	(e) The payment under subsection (d) of this section
5	shall be made upon completion of the fence, purchase of the
6	feed or upon completion of other preventive activity and
7	upon submission to the Wyoming livestock board of a
8	notarized invoice for materials or labor, including the
9	location and length of the fence, the amount of feed and a
10	description of the preventative activity.
11	
12	(f) The Wyoming livestock board may promulgate rules
13	it deems necessary for the implementation of this section.
14	
15	Section 2. There is appropriated seven hundred fifty
16	thousand dollars (\$750,000.00) from the general fund to the
17	Wyoming livestock board. This appropriation shall be for
18	the period beginning with the effective date of this act
19	and ending June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall only be
20	expended for the purpose of conducting brucellosis
21	management activities. Notwithstanding any other provision

of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred or

23 expended for any other purpose and any unexpended,

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1 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall

2 revert as provided by law on June 30, 2010. This

3 appropriation shall not be included in the Wyoming

4 livestock board's 2011-2012 standard biennial budget

5 request.

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7 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2009.
