## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to community colleges; establishing a 2 statewide college system operations and facility funding mechanism based upon a prescribed system wide strategic 3 4 planning process attaching state funding to state interests; providing for system operational budgeting and 5 6 program approval and termination aligned with strategic 7 planning; accordingly aligning system components and system 8 accountability measures; creating a mechanism 9 prioritizing and funding system capital construction needs; 10 modifying facility major maintenance funding and 11 accordingly restricting use of specified 12 delegating authority and imposing duties upon the community 13 college commission, the department of administration and information and upon community college districts; granting 14

- 1 rulemaking authority; imposing reporting requirements;
- 2 prescribing initial strategic plan development; providing
- 3 transitional funding thresholds and funding considerations;
- 4 providing appropriations and authorizing positions; and
- 5 providing for effective dates.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-18-225 is created to read:

- (a) As part of its administrative functions, the community college commission shall forward prioritized community college building needs for development of capital construction budget recommendations by the state building commission in accordance with this section. The commission shall also submit major maintenance budget requests for college buildings to the legislature in accordance with

this section. Major maintenance budget requests shall be

- 21 and guidelines for use by community college districts in
- 22 developing and maintaining comprehensive long-range plans
- 23 for district building needs as required under W.S.

- 1 21-18-304(a)(xi), providing necessary guidance to college
- 2 districts for separating future building space needs and
- 3 requests attached to the statewide college system strategic
- 4 plan from other district space requests;

5

- 6 (iii) Methodologies for use by community college
- 7 districts in computing future student enrollments, building
- 8 space demands and future building needs in establishing
- 9 long-range plans addressing district building needs.

10

- 11 (c) The commission shall conduct and maintain a
- 12 comprehensive assessment of community college buildings and
- 13 future space requirements as defined by the statewide
- 14 strategic plan. The comprehensive building assessment
- 15 shall be designed and maintained to provide timely and
- 16 uniform statewide data on building condition and building
- 17 longevity and future space requirements. The needs
- 18 assessment shall be revised annually to reflect current
- 19 conditions and shall be capable of providing data
- 20 sufficient to accommodate a five (5) year planning cycle.

- 22 (d) On or before November 1 of each year, the
- 23 commission shall, based upon the assessment performed under

- 1 subsection (c) of this section and upon facility plans and
- 2 annual reports submitted by each college pursuant to W.S.
- 3 21-18-304(a)(xi), prioritize community college construction
- 4 needs for the current fiscal year and the succeeding four
- 5 (4) fiscal years based upon:

- 7 (i) Criteria for statewide capacity for education
- 8 programs aligned to the statewide college system strategic
- 9 plan;

- 11 (ii) Analysis of student enrollment changes based
- 12 upon commission approved enrollment projection methodology,
- 13 to determine the need for changes in statewide building
- 14 capacities over time for delivering statewide education
- 15 program needs identified within the strategic plan;

16

- 17 (iii) A methodology and process established by
- 18 the commission for identifying the most critical building
- 19 needs.

- 21 (e) The commission may modify construction needs
- 22 prioritized under subsection (d) of this section in any
- 23 subsequent fiscal year as necessary to address statewide

1 needs as substantiated by data, condition assessments,

2 needs analysis and other information assembled by the

3 commission under this section. Needs receiving a lower

4 priority than previously assigned may be removed or

5 reprioritized by the commission. Construction needs

6 modified under this subsection shall be reported to the

7 general services division of the department of

8 administration and information.

9

10 (f) In addition to subsection (d) of this section and
11 on or before November 1 of each year, the commission shall
12 report college building square footage to the general

13 services division of the department of administration and

14 information as necessary for computation of major building

15 and facility repair and replacement funds for community

16 college buildings. The reported square footage shall be

17 restricted to that square footage necessary for the

18 delivery of education programs comprising the statewide

19 college system strategic plan.

20

21 (g) Upon prioritizing community college construction

22 needs under subsection (d) of this section, the commission

23 shall not later than November 15 of each year, report the

prioritized list to the general services division of the 1 2 department of administration and information. In 3 accordance with W.S. 9-5-108(a)(ii), the general services division shall review, analyze and study construction needs 4 5 prioritized under subsection (d) of this section and 6 conduct necessary value engineering analysis, 7 design review, safety and security assessments and other analysis and review prior to submission of recommendations 8 to the state building commission. 9 The state building 10 commission shall consider and incorporate prioritized 11 construction needs recommendations into legislation 12 requesting necessary funding, developed under W.S. 13 9-5-108(a)(ii)(J), for submission to the legislature for 14 review, authorization and approval. The legislation shall also include a separate appropriation for contingency costs 15 associated with recommended construction projects and a 16 separate appropriation for administrative costs of the 17 18 general services division for management of the recommended 19 construction projects as required by subsection (j) of this 20 section. The community college commission shall submit a separate budget request for project design and planning 21 22 funds to be available to assist community colleges with 23 costs incurred in developing and providing necessary plans,

1 designs and other information to the general services

2 division for purposes of this subsection. The general

3 services division shall consult with the community college

4 commission in developing recommendations under this

5 subsection.

6

7 (h) The commission shall provide copies of the needs

8 assessment, construction priorities and major maintenance

9 square footage established under this section to members of

10 the legislature on or before December 1 of each year.

11

12 (j) Subject to amounts made available by legislative

appropriation and to any conditions which may be attached

14 to appropriation expenditures, the commission shall

15 distribute state funds for building construction approved

16 and authorized by the legislature. Distributions of state

17 funds for any approved and authorized construction project

18 shall be in accordance with payment schedules established

19 by rule and regulation of the commission. Payments by the

20 commission shall be contingent upon the receipt of any

21 local district funding for the capital construction project

22 as may be required by legislative authorization, and shall

23 also include the written approval of the general services

1 division, department of administration and information, of

2 prescribed phases of the construction project and the

3 completion of certain project phases. Construction phases

4 for which approval of the division is required shall be

5 specified by commission rule and regulation, clearly

6 prescribing a process for division review and approval of

7 project plans and specifications, project development and

8 project changes and change orders. In carrying out duties

9 under this subsection, the division may execute powers

10 prescribed under W.S. 9-5-108(a)(iii) in coordination with

11 the commission and the appropriate community college

12 district. No scheduled payment shall be made by the

13 commission without the approval of the division as required

14 by the prescribed process.

15

16 (k) Appropriations for major building and facility

17 repair and replacement shall be distributed by the

18 commission to community colleges in amounts determined by

19 the funding formula developed by the general services

20 division of the department of administration and

21 information, subject to restrictions imposed on qualifying

22 square footage pursuant to this section.

Subject to 1 2 the provisions of this section, funds appropriated for each 3 biennium shall be distributed by the commission to community colleges in amounts determined by a funding 4 5 allocation model adopted by rule of the commission. Funding allocation model components for fixed and variable costs 6 7 shall be defined by and computed in accordance with guidelines and procedures prescribed by rule and regulation 8 9 of the commission, applied to the distribution of state 10 appropriations for each biennial budget period and 11 recalibrated at a schedule specified by rule and regulation 12 of the commission, but in no event less than once every 13 four (4) years. The commission may shall maintain a contingency reserve account in accordance with this 14 derived 15 subsection utilizing any revenue under W.S. 16 9-4-601(b)(iv)(A) to be distributed as a component of the funding allocation model—allocated to community colleges 17 18 for specific use by the colleges for emergency repairs and 19 preventive maintenance of building square footage required for provision of those education programs comprising the 20 21 statewide college system strategic plan. Ιf the 22 unobligated, unencumbered balance of the contingency 23 reserve account established under this subsection is

15 existing on June 30, 2010. In addition, this balance of

16 funds carried forward and existing on June 30, 2010, shall

17 not be restricted in any manner by the commission.

9 that biennium and any reserve fund balance existing on June

10 30, 2007, for that college district.

1 Wyoming community college commission (a) The authorized two (2) additional full-time positions to carry 2 3 prescribed under W.S. out duties 21-18-203(a) 21-18-205(e), as amended by section 2 of this act, and in 4 5 establishing state community college system budgets and administering the allocation of state appropriations as 6 7 required by this act. For purposes of this subsection, two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) is appropriated from 8 9 the general fund to the community college commission for the period commencing on the effective date of this 10 11 subsection and ending June 30, 2010. This position shall also 16 work with the colleges to ensure required and necessary planning information and documentation is prepared and 17 18 submitted to the general services division as necessary to 19 necessary review, study and analysis 20 development of recommendations to the state building 21 One hundred seventy-five thousand dollars commission. 22 (\$175,000.00) is appropriated from the general fund to the

Section 8. [EFFECTIVE DATES]

9 for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section
