13 of this section and ending June 30, 2010, one hundred
14 thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) is appropriated from the

- 2 superintendent to continue the task force established
- 3 pursuant to 2008 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 95, Section
- 4 1001, for purposes of reviewing and evaluating the addition
- 5 of sign language as fulfillment of foreign language
- 6 requirements under the Hathaway student scholarship program
- 7 prescribed by W.S. 21-16-1307. The amount appropriated
- 8 under this subsection shall be expended by the state
- 9 superintendent through the department of education for:

The transcript center will enable the department to provide required statistical studies and 16 17 information to the legislature in accordance with W.S. 18 21-16-1308(c)(vii) and (viii), describing relationships between student high school coursework and subsequent 19 20 student performance on required college entrance 21 assessments and in enrolled post-secondary programs.
