for

- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION requesting Congress to defeat the
- 2 Employee Free Choice Act.

- 4 WHEREAS, the right of employees under the National Labor
- 5 Relations Act to choose whether to be represented by a
- 6 labor organization by way of secret ballot election
- 7 conducted by the National Labor Relations Board is among
- 8 the most important protections afforded under federal labor
- 9 law; and

- 11 WHEREAS, the right of employees to choose by secret ballot
- 12 their union representative is the only method that ensures
- 13 a choice free of coercion and intimidation; and

- 1 WHEREAS, the recognition of a labor organization by private
- 2 agreement, rather than a secret ballot election overseen by
- 3 the National Labor Relations Board, threatens the freedom
- 4 of employees to choose whether to be represented by a labor
- 5 organization and severely limits the ability of the
- 6 National Labor Relations Board to ensure the protection of
- 7 workers; and

- 9 WHEREAS, the Employee Free Choice Act, if it becomes law,
- 10 would eliminate the rights of employees to vote to
- 11 recognize a union by secret ballot, and replace it with the
- 12 card check process, where employees are forced to make
- 13 their choice in front of union supporters; and

- 15 WHEREAS, the Employee Free Choice Act would increase
- 16 potential penalties against employers but not on labor
- 17 organizations for certain violations of the National Labor
- 18 Relations Act, and employers would be subject to paying
- 19 triple back pay and civil penalties of up to twenty
- 20 thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) per violation; and

- 22 WHEREAS, the United States House of Representatives passed
- 23 the Employee Free Choice Act on March 1, 2007 and the
- 24 legislation is now pending before the United States Senate.

2 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE

3 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

5 Section 1. The Legislature of the State of Wyoming urges the United States Senate to defeat the Employee Free 6 Choice Act, which would destroy a system established more 7 than seventy (70) years ago with the enactment of the 8 9 National Labor Relations Act, a system that protects the 10 interests of both the employee and employer by ensuring that both sides have an opportunity to make their case, and 11 by which employees are able to express their decisions in 12

15 Section 2. That the Secretary of State of Wyoming transmit copies of this resolution to the President of the 16 United States, to the President of the Senate and the 17 Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United 18 Wyoming Congressional 19 States Congress and to the Delegation. 20
