A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; prohibiting adult
- 2 sex offenders from access to school properties and events
- 3 as specified; providing exceptions; providing penalties;
- 4 requiring posting of notices as specified; providing
- 5 definitions; amending a definition; and providing for an
- 6 effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-2-320 is created to read:

11

- 12 6-2-320. Prohibited access to school facilities by
- 13 adult sex offenders; exceptions; penalties; definitions.

14

- 15 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this
- 16 section, no person who is eighteen (18) years of age or

1 older who is required to register as a sex offender

2 pursuant to W.S. 7-19-302 shall:

3

(i) Be upon or remain on the premises of any 4 5 school building or school grounds in this state, or upon other properties having a notice posted by a school 6 district in accordance with subsection (b) of this section 7 when the registered offender has reason to believe children 8 9 under the age of eighteen (18) years are present and are 10 involved in a school activity or when children are present 11 within thirty (30) minutes before or after a scheduled

school activity;

(ii) Knowingly loiter on a public way within two 14 thousand (2,000) feet from the property line of school 15 grounds in this state, including properties having a notice 16 17 posted by a school district in accordance with subsection (b) of this section when children under the age of eighteen 18 (18) years are present and are involved in a school 19 activity or when children are present within thirty (30) 20 21 minutes before or after a scheduled school activity;

23 (iii) Be in any vehicle owned or leased by a 24 school to transport students to or from school or a school

related activity when children under the age of eighteen 1 2 (18) years are present in the vehicle; 3 4 (iv) Reside within two thousand (2,000) feet of 5 the property on which a school is located, measured from the nearest point of the exterior wall of the registered 6 offender's dwelling unit to the school's property line, 7 except that this paragraph shall not apply if the 8 9 registered offender's residence was established prior to July 1, 2010. 10 11 (b) Any notice posted by a school district under this 12 13 section shall: 14 (i) Be at least one hundred (100) square inches; 15 16 17 (ii) Make reference to this section; 18 (iii) Include the 19 term "registered sex 20 offender"; 21 (iv) Identify the property as property used by a 22 school within the school district;

1	(v) Be placed at commonly used entrances to the
2	property; and
3	
4	(vi) Be placed at least every six hundred sixty
5	(660) feet along the property line of the property.
6	
7	(c) The provisions of paragraphs (a)(i) and (ii)
8	shall not apply to the extent the registered offender:
9	
10	(i) Is a student in attendance at the school;
11	
12	(ii) Is attending an academic conference or
13	other scheduled extracurricular school event with school
14	officials present when the registered offender is a parent
15	or legal guardian of a child who is participating in the
16	conference or extracurricular event;
17	
18	(iii) Resides at a state licensed or certified
19	facility for incarceration, health or convalescent care
20	that is within two thousand (2,000) feet from the property
21	on which a school is located;
22	

1	(iv) Is dropping off or picking up a child and
2	the registered offender is the child's parent or legal
3	guardian;
4	
5	(v) Is temporarily on school grounds during
6	school hours for the purpose of making a mail, food or
7	other delivery;
8	
9	(vi) Is exercising his right to vote in a public
10	election;
11	
12	(vii) Is taking delivery of his mail through an
13	official post office located on school grounds;
14	
15	(viii) Has written permission from the school
16	principal, vice-principal, or person with equivalent
17	authority, to be on the school grounds or upon other
18	property posted with the notice specified in subsection (b)
19	of this section that the property is used by a school; or
20	
21	(ix) Stays at a homeless shelter or resides at a
22	recovery facility that is within two thousand (2,000) feet
23	from the property on which a school is located if such

1 shelter or facility has been approved for sex offenders by

2 the sheriff or police chief.

3

- 4 (d) Any person who violates the provisions of
- 5 subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor
- 6 and upon conviction, shall be punished by imprisonment for
- 7 not more than six (6) months, a fine of not more than seven
- 8 hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), or both.

9

- 10 (e) Nothing in this section shall prevent a school
- 11 district from adopting more stringent safety and security
- 12 requirements for employees and nonemployees while they are
- 13 in district facilities or on district properties.

14

15 (f) As used in this section:

16

- 17 (i) "Extracurricular event" means any school
- 18 sponsored activity that is outside the regular curriculum,
- 19 occurring during or outside regular school hours, including
- 20 academic, artistic, athletic or recreational activities;

21

- 22 (ii) "Registered offender" means a person who is
- 23 eighteen (18) years of age or older who is required to
- 24 register as a sex offender pursuant to W.S. 7-19-302.
