6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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8 **Section 1.** W.S. 14-4-117 is created to read:

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- 10 14-4-117. Juvenile detention facilities standards;
- 11 definitions; report.

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- 13 (a) Sheriffs, in consultation with other operators of
- 14 juvenile detention facilities, shall develop and implement
- 15 uniform standards based upon nationally recognized criteria
- 16 for the operation of all hardware secure and staff secure
- 17 juvenile detention facilities.

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2 (b) No minor shall be detained in a hardware secure

3 or staff secure juvenile detention facility unless the

4 facility has adopted the standards specified under

5 subsection (a) of this section.

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7 (c) The sheriffs shall report to the joint judiciary

8 interim committee by November 15, 2012 with respect to

9 their progress in developing and implementing the standards

10 specified under subsection (a) of this section.

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12 (d) As used in this section:

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14 (i) "Hardware secure juvenile detention

15 facility" means a facility that:

16

17 (A) Is characterized by locks on the doors

18 and other restrictive hardware designed to restrict the

19 movement of the detained minors and protect public safety;

20 and

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22 (B) Accepts minors for detention as a

23 hardware secure juvenile detention facility under this

24 section.

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2 (ii) "Staff secure juvenile detention facility"

3 means a facility used for the detention of minors that is

4 characterized by a trained staff to supervise the movement

5 and activities of detained minors at the facility, without

6 the additional use of hardware secure equipment.

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8 Section 2.

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10 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this act,

11 this act is effective January 1, 2012.

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13 (b) W.S. 14-4-117(a), created by this act, is

14 effective July 1, 2010.
