8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10	Section 1. W.S. 31-5-301(b)(iii)(A) and (d) and
11	31-5-302 are amended to read:

13	31-5-301. Maximum speed limits.

15	(b) Except when a special hazard exists that requires
16	lower speed for compliance with subsection (a) of this

section, the limits specified in this subsection or established as otherwise authorized shall be maximum lawful speeds and no person shall drive a vehicle on a highway at a speed in excess of maximum limits:

6 (iii) Seventy-five (75) miles per hour on 7 interstate highways. Nothing in this paragraph shall be 8 construed to:

10 (A) Affect the authority of the 11 superintendent to otherwise designate lower <u>or higher</u> 12 maximum speed limits on interstate highways except as 13 provided for in W.S. 31-5-303(b) in accordance with other 14 laws; or

Speeding violations of up to eighty (80) miles 16 (d) 17 per hour where the posted speed limit is at least sixtyfive (65) miles per hour but not more than seventy-five 18 (75) miles per hour, or less than six (6) miles per hour 19 20 over the posted speed limit in all other instances and 21 zones, except violations for exceeding the speed limit in a school zone, or construction zone, and violations received 22 while operating a commercial motor vehicle as defined by 23 24 W.S. 31-7-102(a)(viii), shall not be made a part of the

Establishment of specific maximum speed 5 limits by superintendent. 6 Whenever the superintendent determines upon the basis of an 7 engineering and traffic investigation, or in the event of a 8 vehicle or weather emergency, that a maximum speed greater 9 10 or less than that authorized herein is required for safe and reasonable vehicle operation under the conditions found 11 to exist at any intersection or other place or upon any 12 13 part of the state highway system, the superintendent, 14 except as provided for in W.S. 31-5-303(b), may determine and declare a reasonable and safe maximum limit thereat, 15 which shall be effective when appropriate signs giving 16 17 notice thereof are erected and which shall not exceed eighty (80) miles per hour on interstate highways. 18 The maximum speed limit may be declared to be effective at all 19 20 times or at such times as are indicated upon the signs and 21 differing limits may be established for different times of 22 day, different types of vehicles, varying weather 23 conditions, and other factors bearing on safe speeds, which shall be effective when posted upon appropriate fixed or 24

1	variable signs. This section does not grant power to the
2	superintendent to declare statewide or countywide maximum
3	speed limits but grants power to declare maximum speed
4	limits for the public safety in localized geographic areas.

6	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2012.
