A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to state lands; requiring state agencies to 1 obtain the advice and consent of the board of 2 land commissioners before the receipt, acquisition, exchange, 3 sale or disposal of land; and providing for an effective 4 5 date. 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 Section 1. W.S. 36-2-111 is created to read: 9 10 36-2-111. Advice and consent for the sale, exchange 11 12 or acquisition of land. 13 No state agency, board, commission, department, division or 14 other instrumentality or officer shall receive, acquire, 15

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1 exchange, sell or otherwise dispose of land without first 2 receiving the advice and consent of the board. 3

4 Section 2. W.S. 11-10-107, 19-7-103(b)(x) through 5 (xii) and (xvi), 21-17-204(a)(iv), 23-1-302(a)(iii)(intro), and (v), 33-19-106(b), 35-11-1205(a)(intro), 6 (iv) 36-4-104(a)(i), 36-4-106(a), 36-4-107, 36-4-108(a) 7 and 41-2-114(a)(iv)(C) are amended to read: 8

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11-10-107. Power of board to acquire land; authority 10 make rules and regulations; renting and use of 11 to fairgrounds; gambling and liquor prohibited. 12

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Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, the board may acquire by donation 14 or lease in the name of the state any lands necessary for 15 conducting the state fair, and may make all rules and 16 17 regulations necessary for the conduct and government of the exhibitions, the sale of privileges, and the proper 18 control, operation and conduct of the state fair not 19 20 inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state. 21 The board may rent out or donate the use of the state 22 fairgrounds for stabling and training stock and holding stock sales. The grounds may be used free of charge for 23 24 encampment grounds for the state militia under the

direction of the adjutant general of the state. The board 1 may permit the grounds and facilities to be used for other 2 3 purposes and may charge fees as it deems necessary to pay 4 the expenses of maintaining the grounds and facilities. The 5 board shall not permit any gambling device of any nature to be operated on the grounds, or permit any unlawful betting, 6 or permit any intoxicating liquors to be sold thereon 7 except as provided by W.S. 12-4-505. 8

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10 19-7-103. Adjutant general; appointment; rank;
11 removal; duties and qualifications.

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(b) The adjutant general of Wyoming shall have powersand duties and be paid a salary as follows:

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Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, he may purchase 16 (\mathbf{x}) 17 for cash or upon contract or otherwise acquire lands within Wyoming for use by the national quard or for the use of 18 other elements of the armed forces as an artillery and 19 20 target range and training and maneuvering area. He may 21 acquire lands for such purposes by eminent domain when the 22 state board of land commissioners gives its written approval or consent; 23

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1 (xi) Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, he may accept gifts of land for the purposes provided by paragraph (x) of 2 3 this subsection and may lease, or accept payment in kind as 4 consideration for any lease, any of the acquired parcels of 5 land or buildings during periods when the lands are not in use for military purposes. He may acquire and install on 6 the land such permanent improvements, including fences, as 7 may be necessary for the full utilization of the land for 8 9 the military purposes herein declared;

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11 (xii) Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, he may dispose of lands, buildings or fixtures under the control of the 12 13 department by sale, exchange or other transfer. He may execute deeds for such transfers in the name of the state. 14 Money from such sale, exchange or transfer may be utilized 15 for the acquisition of additional lands, buildings or 16 17 fixtures within the same budget biennium. Any such sale, exchange or other transfer shall be conducted in accordance 18 with the provisions of W.S. 36-9-101, 36-9-102 and 36-9-104 19 20 through 36-9-120, except these provisions of W.S. title 36, 21 chapter 9 shall not apply when both the title to the land and to all buildings thereon is solely in the name of the 22 department or any division of the department and the 23 24 provisions of W.S. 9-2-1016(b)(viii) also shall not apply

when both the title to the land and to all buildings 1 thereon is solely in the name of the department or any 2 division of the department. The sections of title 36 3 identified in this paragraph and W.S. 9-2-1016(b)(viii) 4 5 also shall not apply when any such sale, exchange or other transfer is to another governmental entity, state agency or 6 local government, as defined in W.S. 1-39-103, even if the 7 title to the land and to all buildings thereon are not 8 9 solely in the name of the department or a division thereof; 10

He shall control all armories that are 11 (xvi) owned, erected, purchased, leased or provided by the state. 12 13 Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, he may acquire, in the name of the state of Wyoming, by purchase, donation or dedication 14 any property which may be used for military purposes. For 15 the control and management of armories described in this 16 17 paragraph, he may establish armory boards whose personnel shall serve without pay. Subject to his direction, armory 18 boards shall control, manage and supervise all activities 19 armories and armories 20 in may rent to persons or 21 organizations not connected with the organized militia;

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23 21-17-204. Additional powers and duties; sectarian or
 24 partisan instruction or test prohibited.

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2 The board of trustees shall prescribe rules for (a) 3 the government of the university and all its branches, elect the requisite officers, professors, instructors and 4 5 employees, a director of finance and budget and a superintendent of buildings and grounds, any of whom may be 6 removed for cause, and fix the salary and term of office of 7 each. 1 The commission is directed and empowered: 2 (a) 3 (iii) Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, to acquire lands 4 5 and waters in the name of Wyoming by purchase, lease, agreement, gift or devise, not including powers of eminent 6 domain, and to develop, improve, operate, and maintain the 7 same for the following purposes: 8 9 10 (iv) Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, to acquire 11 easements and construct suitable access roads leading to public lands and department lands and waters acquired 12 13 pursuant to W.S. 23-1-302(a)(iii); 14 15 (v) Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, to sell, exchange, lease or assign any fee ownership interest in any land, 16 17 water, or other property heretofore or hereafter acquired; 18 19 33-19-106. Screening; relocation removal of or junkyards; condemnation proceedings. 20 21 22 (b) When the commission determines that the topography of the land adjoining the interstate or primary 23 24 systems will not permit adequate screening of such 2013

1 junkyards, or that the screening would not be economically 2 feasible, the commission may require the relocation, 3 removal or disposal of the junk and junkyard by negotiation 4 condemnation. Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, when the or 5 commission determines that it is in the best interests of the state, it may acquire such land or interest in land as 6 necessary to provide adequate screening of the junkyards. 7 8 35-11-1205. Land acquisition and disposal. 9 10 11 Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, the state may acquire (a) any land, by purchase, donation or condemnation, which is 12 adversely affected by past coal mining practices if the 13 director, with the concurrence of the governor, finds that 14 land is necessary to successful 15 acquisition of the reclamation and that: 16 17 36-4-104. Powers; interpretive service agreements. 18 19 department of state parks and cultural 20 (a) The 21 resources, in consultation with the commission, may, 22 subject to the provisions of this act: 23

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1 (i) Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, acquire and accept title in the name of the state of Wyoming, by grant, 2 3 dedication, gift, devise, donation, or demise, to any lands 4 suitable as an outdoor recreation area or facility; 5 36-4-106. Plan for acquisition and development 6 of 7 resources; authority of department; coordination of activities; exceptions; agreements with United States; 8 9 state archaeologist. 10 11 (a) The department of state parks and cultural resources, in consultation with the commission, shall 12 13 prepare, maintain and keep up to date a comprehensive plan for the acquisition and development of outdoor recreation 14 resources of the state. The department and the commission 15 shall prepare the comprehensive plan in accordance with 16 17 subsections (e) and (f) of this section. Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, authority is hereby granted to the department of 18 state parks and cultural resources, in consultation with 19 20 the commission, to develop, operate and maintain outdoor

21 recreation areas and facilities of the state and to acquire 22 pursuant to provisions of law, but not by the power of eminent domain, land, waters and interest in land and 23 24 waters for such areas and facilities. Authority is hereby

granted to the department, in consultation with the 1 commission, to enter into contracts and agreements with the 2 3 United States, or any appropriate agency thereof, to keep 4 financial and other records relating thereto, and to 5 furnish to appropriate officials and agencies of the United States such reports and information as may be reasonably 6 necessary to enable such officials or agencies to perform 7 their duties under the provisions of Public Law 88-578 or 8 9 any other applicable federal statutes.

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36-4-107. Authority to lease; exchange of lands and 11 contracts with United States. 12

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The department, in consultation with the commission, shall 14 have the power and is hereby authorized to lease, grant or 15 operate any outdoor recreation area or facility belonging 16 17 to the state which is not subject to lease, grant or operation by another agency of the state. Subject to W.S. 18 19 36-2-111, the department, in consultation with the may exchange state lands which are 20 commission, not 21 appropriated to other use for United States outdoor 22 recreation areas and facilities, and under contract with the United States, may take over the management, leasing 23 and operation of any such area or facility. Where the 24

department deems it to be in the best interest of the state, it may, in consultation with the commission, contract with the United States government or any authorized federal agency for the operation of any outdoor recreation area or facility established by the department.

7 36-4-108. Acquisition and supervision of historical
8 parks and sites.

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10 Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, the department, in (a) consultation with the commission, may receive or acquire, 11 but not by use of the power of eminent domain, historical 12 13 parks and sites within the state. Nothing in this section limits the authority of the department to receive, acquire 14 and to maintain, but not by use of the power of eminent 15 domain, land for other outdoor recreation areas 16 and 17 facilities. The department shall be subject to the provisions of W.S. 36-4-106(e) and (f) when acting pursuant 18 to this section. 19

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The commission shall, on the basis of the state 1 (a) water plan or as otherwise directed by the legislature and 2 after consultation with and advice from state agencies and 3 officials, other appropriate agencies and officials, the 4 5 joint business council of the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapaho Indian tribes, the business council of the Eastern 6 Shoshone Indian tribe, the business council of the Northern 7 Arapaho Indian tribe and members of the public, identify 8 9 and select potential projects to be studied for inclusion in the Wyoming water development program pursuant to the 10 11 following schedule:

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13 (iv) Level III construction and operation plans shall proceed as authorized and approved by the legislature 14 immediate direction and control 15 under the of the commission. 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(C) Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, acquire by 1 2 purchase, lease, appropriation, gift, exchange or eminent domain, necessary land, easements and other property for 3 4 construction, operation and maintenance of water projects 5 and accept gifts, grants and contributions of money from any source; 6 7 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 8 9 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 10
