## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to regulation of health care facilities;
- 2 requiring review and modification of rules governing
- 3 assisted living facilities; providing for an ad hoc
- 4 advisory committee on modification of assisted living
- 5 facility rules; providing for reports; and providing for
- 6 effective dates.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-2-908 is amended to read:

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12 35-2-908. Rules and regulations.

- 14 (a) The department shall promulgate and enforce
- 15 reasonable rules and regulations necessary to protect the

1	health, safety and welfare of patients of health care
2	facilities licensed under this act.
3	
4	(b) The regulations governing assisted living
5	facilities shall be modified to provide that:
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7	(i) Services provided by an assisted living
8	facility may include the following care provided that the
9	care is within the professional scope of practice of the
10	person providing it or is care that an able and willing
11	family member could provide at home with ad hoc training,
12	periodic inspection and appropriate follow up by a health
13	<pre>care professional:</pre>
14	
15	(A) Care of open skin lesions without
16	complications;
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18	(B) Changing of catheter collection bags;
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20	(C) Catheter care, including changing of
21	tubing;
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23	(D) Care of residents with occasional
24	bladder incontinency;

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2	(E) Care of residents on continuous oxygen
3	supplementation even if the resident is unable to determine
4	if the oxygen is on or off and is unable to adjust the flow
5	or turn the oxygen on, provided the patient's health
6	condition would tolerate a lack of continuous oxygen
7	therapy.
8	
9	(ii) For all of the conditions identified
10	pursuant to paragraph (i) of this subsection, an assisted
11	living facility shall have the right to declare that a
12	specific resident's condition is beyond the ability of the
13	facility to provide care and to require that the resident
14	obtain outside professional assistance or move to a
15	different facility;
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17	(iii) Services identified in paragraph (i) of
18	this subsection may be provided through the assisted living
19	facility's employees or outside professionals contracted by
20	the facility;
21	
22	(iv) If the facility has a contract with a
23	Wyoming licensed dietician, it shall not be required to
24	have a certified dietary manager;

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2 (v) Staffing shall be adjusted according to an 3 established staffing policy of the assisted living facility as necessary to provide for the acuity level in the 4 5 facility. 6 Section 2. 7 8 9 The department of health shall conduct a review (a) of regulations governing assisted living facilities and 10 11 modify them necessary to achieve the following as objectives: 12 13 An assisted living facility should have the 14 (i) ability to provide residents with assistance in performing 15 the tasks of daily living and provide care that an able and 16 17 willing family member would be able to perform in the home with ad hoc training from an appropriate professional and 18 with appropriate periodic inspection and follow up; 19 20 (ii) It is in the interest of the people and the 21 22 state of Wyoming for residents of assisted living facilities to be able to remain in those facilities as long 23

as possible before transferring to a more restrictive and

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expensive skilled nursing facility only when 1 more

2 necessary.

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(b) To assist in conducting its review of regulations 4

5 pursuant to subsection (a) of this section, the department

may convene an ad hoc advisory committee consisting of 6

representatives of assisted living facilities, health care 7

professionals and public representatives. 8

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If necessary to comply with federal Medicaid law 10

11 and regulations, the department may provide separately for

restrictions on services provided by assisted living 12

facilities to residents who are Medicaid clients or for 13

restrictions on assisted living facilities that accept 14

Medicaid clients. 15

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The department of health shall report to the 17 (d)

joint labor, health and social services interim committee 18

by November 1, 2013 and September 1, 2014 regarding its 19

review of regulations and changes to regulations 20 as

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21 provided in this section.
