disclose a material fact with the intention of preventing 1 2 or reducing the payment of benefits to any entitled 3 individual, to avoid being subject to this act or to avoid 4 or reduce any contribution or other payment required from 5 an employing unit under this act, or willfully fail or refuse to make any contribution or other payment. Any such 6 individual violating this subsection is quilty of a 7 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 8 9 ninety (90) days, a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), or both. Each false statement, 10 11 misrepresentation, failure to properly classify an individual as an employee or failure to disclose a material 12
