ACT relating to discrimination; prohibiting 1 AN 2 discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity as specified; providing an exception; and 3 4 providing for an effective date. 5 6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 7 Section 1. W.S. 6-9-104 is created to read: 8 9 10 6-9-104. Religious exemption. 11 12 (a) Nothing in this article or any other provision of 13 law related to discrimination in employment shall be deemed 14 to apply to any of the employment practices of a religious

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1 corporation, association, educational institution or 2 society which has as its primary purpose religious ritual 3 or worship or the teaching or spreading of religious 4 doctrine or belief.

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(b) For any religious corporation, association, 6 educational institution or society that is not wholly 7 8 exempt under subsection (a) of this section, this article or any other provision of law related to discrimination in 9 10 employment shall not apply with respect to the employment 11 of individuals whose duties are ministerial, in that they 12 consist of teaching or spreading religious doctrine or 13 belief, religious governance, supervision of a religious order, supervision of persons teaching or spreading 14 15 religious doctrine or belief or supervision or 16 participation in religious ritual or worship.

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18 (c) Nothing in this article or any other provision of 19 law related to discrimination shall be construed to limit 20 the rights available to a religious corporation, 21 association, educational institution or society under any 22 federal law that establishes protections for freedom of 23 speech and free exercise of religion, including legal

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standards and rights available under the first amendment to 1 2 the United States Constitution. 3 4 Section 2. Equal enjoyment of public accommodations and 18 facilities; penalties. 19 20 (a) All persons of good deportment are entitled to 21 the full and equal enjoyment of all accommodations, 22 advantages, facilities and privileges of all places or 23 agencies which are public in nature, or which invite the

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patronage of the public, without any distinction, 1 2 discrimination or restriction on account of race, religion, 3 color, sex, sexual orientation or gender identity or 4 national origin. 5 6-9-102. Discrimination prohibited; penalties. 6 7 8 (a) No person shall be denied the right to life, liberty, pursuit of happiness or the necessities of life 9 10 because of race, color, sex, sexual orientation or gender 11 identity, creed or national origin. 12 13 9-2-1022. Duties of department performed through 14 human resources division. 15 16 (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, the department through the human resources division shall: 17 18 19 (v) Maintain a register of applications made by 20 all persons seeking employment with an agency. Each 21 application shall be rated on the basis of suitability and qualifications without regard to political affiliation, 22

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race, color, sex, sexual orientation or gender identity, 1 2 creed or age; 3 4 14-4-201. Quality child care system established. 5 (f) In the delivery of services, facilities that 6 receive funds under this article shall not discriminate 7 8 against any individual on the basis of sex, sexual 9 orientation or gender identity, color, race, religion, 10 national origin, disability or age other than the age of 11 the qualifying child. Creation of veterans' commission; 16 composition; terms.

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(a) A Wyoming veterans' commission is created within
the military department consisting of twelve (12) members,
not less than one (1) of whom shall reside in each judicial
district identified in W.S. 5-3-101, appointed by the
governor for staggered terms of three (3) years.
Commencing with initial appointments made in 2005, four (4)

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members of the board shall be appointed for a term of one 1 2 (1) year, four (4) members for a term of two (2) years and 3 four (4) members for a term of three (3) years. Terms 4 thereafter shall be three (3) years and staggered with one-5 third (1/3) of the members' terms expiring each year. Appointments shall be made without regard to political 6 affiliation, sex, sexual orientation or gender identity, 7 8 religion or ethnic background. The governor may remove any member as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. A chairman shall be 9 10 elected by the commission from among its members and a new chairman elected every two (2) years thereafter. 11 12 21-3-304. Charter school; requirements; authority. 13 14 15 (c) A charter school shall be subject to all federal 16 and state laws and constitutional provisions prohibiting discrimination on the basis of disability, race, creed, 17 18 color, gender, sexual orientation or gender identity, 19 national origin, religion, ancestry or need for special 20 education services. Enrollment decisions shall be made in a 21 nondiscriminatory manner specified by the charter school 22 applicant in the charter school application. Enrollment

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decisions shall not discriminate against at-risk students 1 2 or special program students. 3 4 21-4-302. Age for registration in first grade and 5 kindergarten; preschool programs. 6 (d) A program shall not discriminate in enrollment on 7 8 the basis of sex, sexual orientation or gender identity, 9 race, religion or national origin. 10 11 21-4-303. Right not denied on account of sex, race or 12 religion. 13 14 No child shall be denied the right to attend the public 15 schools of this state on account of sex, sexual orientation 16 or gender identity, race, or religion. 17 21-7-302. Discrimination in compensation prohibited. 18 19 20 No discrimination in the amount of compensation for the 21 teachers in the public schools of this state shall be made 22 on account of sex, sexual orientation or gender identity, 23 race or religious belief.

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5 (a) No employer shall discriminate, within the same establishment in which the employees are employed, between 6 employees on the basis of gender, gender identity or sexual 7 8 orientation by paying wages to employees at a rate less 9 than the rate at which the employer pays wages to employees 10 of the opposite gender, gender identity or sexual 11 orientation for equal work on jobs the performance of which 12 requires equal skill, effort and responsibility and which 13 are performed under similar working conditions, except 14 where the payment is made pursuant to:
