2	the "Wyoming Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine Practice

6	acupuncture and oriental medicine in Wyoming on and after

prevention of disease or the treatment of any ailment, 1 2 disease, pain, injury, deformity or physical condition; 3 (iv) "Acupuncturist" means any person who 4 provides for compensation, or holds himself out to the 5 public as providing, acupuncture and oriental medicine 6 services; 7 8 (v) "Board" means the state board of acupuncture 9 10 and oriental medicine created under this chapter; 11 12 (vi) "Licensee" means an acupuncturist licensed under W.S. 33-49-108; 13 14 (viii) "NCCAOM" means the national certification 15 16 commission for acupuncture and oriental medicine; 17 18 (ix) "Practice of acupuncture and oriental medicine" includes: 19 20 21 (A) Stimulation of points on the body 22 through the use of needles, lancets, moxibustion, Qigong, 23 thermal methods, herbal preparations, light, sound,

vibration, pressure, magnetism, electricity, suction, water 1 2 or other means; 3 4 (B) Manual therapy including massage, acupressure, acupuncture, trigger point dry needling, 5 reflexology, shiatsu, mobilization, manipulation, cupping, 6 tuina and acutotement; 7 8 9 (C) Auricular, hand, nose, face, foot and 10 scalp microsystem therapy; 11 12 (D) Adjunctive therapies including dietary and nutritional counseling, recommendation of breathing 13 techniques and therapeutic exercises and lifestyle, 14 15 behavioral and stress counseling; 16 17 (E) Diagnostic techniques including observation, listening, smelling, inquiring, palpitation, 18 19 electrodermal screenings, thermography and the routine use 20 of functional testing through physical or laboratory tests; 21

- 17 (a) The state board of acupuncture and oriental
- 18 medicine is created to implement and administer this
- 19 chapter. The board shall consist of five (5) members. The
- 20 initial board shall consist of one (1) member of the public
- 21 and four (4) members who shall have been engaged in the
- 22 practice of acupuncture and oriental medicine for a period
- 23 of not less than five (5) years immediately preceding

- 1 appointment to the board. Thereafter, the four (4) members
- 2 engaged in the practice of acupuncture and oriental
- 3 medicine shall be licensed under this chapter prior to
- 4 appointment to the board.

- 6 (b) The governor shall appoint the members of the

If a person fails to renew his license or 18 certification pursuant to the schedule established by the 19 board, the license or certification shall expire as 20 provided in W.S. 33-49-113. (f) Each acupuncturist shall report to the board any 1 2 judgment or administrative action, as well as the terms of 3 any settlement or other disposition of any judgment or 4 action, against the acupuncturist involving malpractice or improper practice of acupuncture, whether occurring in 5 Wyoming or in any other jurisdiction. The acupuncturist 6 shall make the report either within thirty (30) days after 7 8 the judgment or action or upon application for licensure or 9 reinstatement, whichever occurs earlier. 10 11 (g) As a condition of licensure, every acupuncturist 12 shall purchase and maintain commercial professional 13 liability insurance with an insurance company authorized to 14 do business in this state in a minimum indemnity amount of: 15 16 (i) Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) incident and fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) per year, 17 18 if practicing as a sole proprietor or general partnership; 19 20 (ii) Three hundred thousand dollars 21 (\$300,000.00) per incident and three hundred thousand 22 dollars (\$300,000.00) per year, if practicing as a limited

liability company or a corporation.

2 33-49-109. Licensure by endorsement.

3

4 (a) The board shall issue a license by endorsement to engage in the practice of acupuncture and oriental medicine 5 in this state to any applicant who has a license in good 6 standing as an acupuncturist under the laws of another 7 8 jurisdiction if the applicant presents satisfactory proof 9 to the board that, at the time of application for a license 10 by endorsement, the applicant possesses substantially equivalent credentials and qualifications to those required 11 12 for licensure pursuant to this chapter.

13

14 (b) The board shall specify by rule what shall 15 constitute "substantially equivalent credentials and 16 qualifications" for the purposes of this section.

17

18 (c) The board shall establish a fee to be paid by any 19 applicant for licensure by endorsement.

20

21 (d) For the purposes of this section, "in good 22 standing" means a license that has not been revoked or

1 suspended or against which there are no disciplinary or

2 adverse actions.

4 33-49-110. Licensure required; exceptions.

6 (a) Nothing in this chapter shall interfere with, or
7 be interpreted to interfere with or prevent, any other
8 licensed health care professional from practicing within
9 the scope of his practice as specified in this title,
10 provided that no licensed health care professional shall
11 hold himself out as an acupuncturist or use any title under

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12 subsection (c) of this section unless the person is

13 licensed under this chapter.

15 (b) No person shall practice acupuncture and oriental
16 medicine without a valid and current license on file with
17 the board, unless the acupuncturist has met the
18 requirements of subsection (d) of this section. No person
19 shall practice Chinese herbal medicine in this state unless
20 the person has obtained a certification from the board

(c) It is unlawful for any person to hold himself out 1 2 in any manner as being authorized to practice acupuncture, 3 oriental medicine or Chinese herbology or use the title 4 "licensed acupuncturist," "registered acupuncturist," "doctor of oriental medicine," or "doctor of acupuncture 5 and oriental medicine" or use the designation "L.Ac.," 6 "R.Ac.," "D.O.M." or "O.M.D." or any variant thereof, 7 unless the person is licensed under this chapter. It is 8 unlawful for any person to use the title of "diplomate of 9 10 acupuncture," "diplomate of Chinese herbology," or "diplomate of oriental medicine" or the designation of 11 "Dipl. Ac.," "Dipl. C.H." or "Dipl. O.M." unless the person 12 13 is nationally certified with NCCAOM and licensed under this 14 chapter.

15

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section to
the contrary, a person in training may practice acupuncture
and oriental medicine without a valid and current license
on file with the division if such practice takes place in
the course of a bona fide training program and:

22 (i) All acupuncture acts and services performed 23 by the person are performed under the direct, on-site

1 supervision of a licensed acupuncturist, who shall be

2 responsible for all such acts and services as though the

3 licensed acupuncturist had personally performed them; and

5 (ii) The name and current residence address of

6 the person has been reported to the board by the licensed

7 acupuncturist supervising the person.

9 33-49-111. Temporary licensure.

10

11 (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter to

12 the contrary, a person may practice acupuncture and

13 oriental medicine without a valid and current license if

14 the person has been issued a temporary license by the board

15 under this section.

16

17 (b) The board may issue a temporary license to a

18 person who has a license in good standing as an

19 acupuncturist under the laws of another jurisdiction or who

20 has a license in another health care profession if the

21 person possesses the knowledge and skills that are included

22 in the scope of the practice of acupuncture and oriental

23 medicine in Wyoming.

3	a person who is under the sponsorship of an acupuncturist
4	licensed in this state and who submits an application and
5	fee as provided by rule and regulation of the board,
6	provided that no fee shall be charged if the license is for

8	A temporary license shall only be valid for the limited
9	purpose specified in the license and shall not exceed one
10	(1) year. The board shall only issue a temporary license

1 (a) Each licensed acupuncturist shall complete thirty

2 (30) hours of continuing education every two (2) years.

3 Each continuing education course shall be sponsored by

4 NCCAOM or another accrediting institution upon approval

5 from the board.

7 (b) An instructor in a course of continuing education

8 which is approved by the board may receive continuing

9 education credit as approved by the board at the rate of

10 one (1) hour of credit for every twelve (12) hours of

11 instruction. No person shall receive more than eighteen

12 (18) hours of instruction credit under this subsection in

13 any two (2) year period.

17 (a) Each licensee shall renew his license every two

18 (2) years by submitting, prior to the date established by

19 the board, the fee and application required by rule and

20 regulation of the board. The application shall include

21 proof of continuing education as required under W.S.

22 33-49-112 and other information as the board may require.

23

1 (b) The board shall allow a sixty (60) day grace

2 period following the expiration of a license. A person may

3 renew a license during the grace period under this

4 subsection if the person complies with the requirements of

5 subsection (a) of this section and pays a late fee as

6 determined by the board.

7

8 (c) A license which is not renewed following the

9 expiration of the sixty (60) day grace period under

10 subsection (b) of this section is expired and the licensee

11 shall not practice acupuncture in this state. The board

12 may through rule and regulation allow for reinstatement of

13 an expired license within one (1) year of expiration. If a

14 license has been expired for more than one (1) year, the

15 board shall require the person to apply as a new applicant.

20 (a) Each acupuncturist shall provide the following

21 information in writing to each patient during the initial

22 patient contact:

1 (i) The name, business address and business

2	phone number of the acupuncturist;

4	(ii) A fee schedule;

6	(iii) A statement indicating that:

8	(A) The patient is entitled to receive
9	information about the methods of therapy, the techniques
10	used and the duration of therapy, if known;

12	(B) The patient may seek a second opinion
13	from another health care professional or may terminate
14	therapy at any time;
15	
16	(C) In a professional relationship, sexual
17	intimacy is never appropriate and should be reported to the
18	board.
19	
20	(iv) A listing of the acupuncturist's education,
21	experience, degrees, membership in a professional
22	organization whose membership includes not less than one-
23	third $(1/3)$ of the persons licensed pursuant to this

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1 chapter, certificates or credentials related to acupuncture

2 awarded by such organizations, the length of time required

3 to obtain said degrees or credentials and experience;

4

5 (v) A statement indicating any license,

6 certificate or registration in acupuncture or any other

7 health care profession which was issued to the

8 acupuncturist by any local, state or national health care

9 agency, and indicating whether any such license,

10 certificate or registration was suspended or revoked.

11

12 (b) Any changes in the information required by

13 subsection (a) of this section shall be made in the

14 mandatory disclosure within five (5) days of the change.

15

16 (c) The acupuncturist shall retain a copy of the

17 written information specified in subsection (a) of this

18 section, dated and signed by the patient, from the time of

19 the initial evaluation until at least five (5) years after

20 the termination of treatment.

21

22 33-49-115. License revocation; discipline.

23

1 (a) The board may revoke, suspend or refuse to renew 2 any license or permit or place on probation, or otherwise 3 reprimand a licensee or permit holder or deny a license to 4 an applicant if, after hearing, it finds that the person: 5 (i) Violated the provisions of W.S. 33-49-110; 6 7 8 (ii) Failed to provide the mandatory disclosure required by W.S. 33-49-114 or provided false, deceptive or 9 10 misleading information to patients in the disclosure; 11 12 (iii) Failed to provide the information required by W.S. 33-49-108(a) or provided false, deceptive or 13 misleading information to the board during application for 14 initial licensure or certification, temporary licensure or 15 16 renewal of a license under this chapter; 17 18 (iv) Committed, or advertised in any manner that 19 he will commit, any act constituting a fraudulent insurance 20 act as determined by the board; 21

1 (v) Failed to refer a patient to an appropriate 2 practitioner when the problem of the patient is beyond the 3 training, experience or competence of the acupuncturist; 4 5 (vi) Accepted commissions or rebates or other forms of remuneration for referring clients to 6 other professionals; 7 8 9 (vii) Offered or gave commissions, rebates or other forms of remuneration for the referral of clients; 10 except that, notwithstanding the provisions of this 11 12 paragraph, an acupuncturist may pay an independent 13 advertising or marketing agent compensation for advertising 14 or marketing services rendered on his behalf by such agent, 15 including compensation which is paid for the results of 16 performance of such services, on a per patient basis; 17 18 (viii) Failed to comply with, or aided or 19 abetted a failure to comply with, the requirements of this 20 chapter or any lawful rules or regulations adopted by the 21 board, including those regulations governing the proper cleaning and sterilization of acupuncture needles or the 22 23 sanitary conditions of acupuncture offices;

2 (ix) Engaged in sexual contact as defined in

3 W.S. 6-2-301(a) (vi) or sexual intrusion as defined in W.S.

4 6-2-301(a)(vii) with a patient during the period of time

5 beginning with the initial patient evaluation and ending

6 with the termination of treatment;

8 (x) Departed from, or failed to conform to,

9 minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under

10 the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual

11 injury to a patient is established;

13 (xi) Continued in the practice of acupuncture

14 and oriental medicine while subject to any physical or

15 mental disability which renders the acupuncturist unable to

16 treat patients with reasonable skill and safety or which

17 may endanger a patient's health or safety, or continued in

18 the practice of acupuncture and oriental medicine while

19 afflicted with a communicable, infectious or contagious

20 disease of a serious nature which renders the acupuncturist

21 unable to treat patients with reasonable skill and safety

22 or which may endanger a patient's health or safety;

23

1 (xii) Continued in the practice of acupuncture 2 and oriental medicine while addicted to or dependent upon 3 alcohol or upon any habit forming drug or while abusing or 4 habitually or excessively using any habit forming drug or defined 5 any controlled substance as in W.S. 35-7-1002(a)(iv);6 7 8 (xiii) Committed and been convicted of a felony or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to a felony; 9 10 11 (xiv) Published or circulated, directly 12 indirectly, any fraudulent, false, deceitful or misleading 13 claims or statements relating to acupuncture and oriental 14 medicine or to the acupuncturist's practice, capabilities, services, methods or qualifications. 15 16 17 (b) The board may accept, as prima facie evidence of the commission of any act enumerated in subsection (a) of 18 19 this section, evidence of disciplinary action taken by 20 another jurisdiction against an acupuncturist's license or 21 other authorization to practice if disciplinary action was 22 based upon acts or practices substantially similar to those

enumerated in subsection (a) of this section.

33-49-116. Board hearings; investigations.

4 (a) Upon receipt of written complaint by the board charging a person with having been quilty of any of the 5 acts described in W.S. 33-49-115, the board shall make an 6 investigation. If the board finds reasonable grounds for 7 8 the complaint, a time and place for a hearing shall be set, notice of which shall be served on the licensee or 9 10 applicant at least fifteen (15) calendar days prior 11 thereto. The notice shall be by personal service or by 12 certified or registered mail sent to the last known address 13 of the person.

14

15 (b) The board may issue subpoenas for the attendance
16 of witnesses and the production of necessary evidence in
17 any hearing before it. Upon request of the respondent or
18 his counsel, the board shall issue subpoenas on behalf of
19 the respondent.

20

21 (c) Hearing procedures shall be promulgated in 22 accordance with, and a person aggrieved by a decision of

1 the board may take an appeal pursuant to, the Wyoming

2 Administrative Procedure Act.
