A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government; creating the Vision 2020 comprehensive expenditure and 2 3 revenue review; providing for oversight of the review by the management council of the Wyoming legislature; creating 4 5 the Vision 2020 comprehensive expenditure and revenue 6 review advisory panel; creating areas of review; providing for the creation of task forces as specified; providing for 7 appointment of members to the advisory panel and task 8 9 forces; providing for assignment of duties as specified; providing for reports; providing an appropriation; and 10 providing for an effective date. 11

13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

14

1 Section 1.

2

3 There is created the Vision 2020 comprehensive (a) 4 expenditure and revenue review. The management council of 5 the Wyoming legislature shall oversee the comprehensive expenditure and revenue review. Not later than May 1, 6 2015, the management council, in consultation with the 7 8 Vision 2020 comprehensive expenditure and revenue review advisory panel created in subsection (b) of this section, 9 10 shall assign the responsibility for reviewing 11 expenditures, revenues, tax exemptions and permanent and 12 nonpermanent savings to either a joint interim committee of the Wyoming legislature, the joint appropriations committee 13 14 or task forces created by management council under this 15 act.

16

17 (b) There is created the Vision 2020 comprehensive 18 expenditure and revenue review advisory panel consisting of 19 the current governor, the speaker of the house of 20 representatives, the president of the senate, all living 21 former Wyoming governors wishing to participate and current 22 and former joint appropriations committee chairmen wishing

1 to participate, who served as chairman of the committee on
2 or after January 1, 1990. The advisory panel shall:

4 (i) Be co-chaired by the current governor

and the president of the senate;

7 (ii) Be consulted for recommendations,

8 advice and peer review functions regarding the examination

9 directed in paragraph (d)(vii) of this section or such

10 other parts of this act as requested by management council;

13 (iii) For all members of the Vision 2020

14 comprehensive expenditure and revenue review advisory

15 panel, other than the governor, be paid the same salary,

16 per diem and mileage as members of the legislature

17 traveling to and from meetings or while in actual

18 attendance at meetings of the advisory panel and during the

19 performance of their duties relative thereto as if the

20 advisory panel was an interim committee of the legislature.

21

(c) The management council of the Wyoming legislature

23 shall establish such task forces as it deems necessary to

1 complete the Vision 2020 review and may make appointments

2 from members of the legislature, executive branch personnel

3 from Wyoming state government and members of the Wyoming

4 public. In making appointments to the task forces, the

5 management council shall apportion the legislative

6 membership of each task force as nearly as possible to

7 reflect the percentage of the elected membership of the

8 majority and minority parties of the full legislature and

9 shall appoint at least one (1) member from each major party

10 of each house of the legislature to each established task

11 force.

13 (d) In making assignments of duties under subsection

14 (a) of this section, the management council, in

15 consultation with the Vision 2020 advisory panel:

17 (i) Shall apportion the work among the task

18 forces and committees as equally as possible;

20 (ii) Is not required to make assignments based

21 upon the traditional subject matter jurisdiction of the

22 joint interim committee;

1 (iii) Shall notify all legislators of 2 assignments made to each committee or task force; 3 4 (iv) Shall provide for a comprehensive review of total state expenditures, including emphasis on those 5 agencies or programs identified by management council as 6 having the highest rate of growth over the last decade; 7 8 (v) Shall provide for a comprehensive review of 9 total state revenues and an evaluation of major revenue 10 11 streams; 12 (vi) Shall provide for an examination of 13 14 statutory tax exemptions, with an emphasis on tax exemptions requiring an appropriation of state funds; 15 16 17 (vii) Shall provide for a comprehensive examination of additional or alternative sources of revenue 18 19 or revenue streams to the state; 20 (viii) Shall provide for a comprehensive 21 22 examination of all statutorily mandated cost-of-living

1 adjustments, escalators or other mechanisms which increase

2 expenditures without budgetary authority or review; and

4 (ix) Shall provide for an examination of

5 permanent and nonpermanent reserve account balances of the

6 state and make recommendations for statutory changes in

7 recognition of the state's revenue volatility, regarding:

9 (A) The level of permanent and nonpermanent

10 reserve accounts including but not limited to the

11 legislative stabilization reserve account created by 2005

12 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 191, Section 4, Section

13 301(d), the strategic investments and projects account

14 created by 2013 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 73, Section

 $15 \quad 300\,(e)\,$, the school foundation program reserve account

16 created by 2014 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 26, Section

17 300(g) and the permanent land fund holding account created

18 by 2012 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 16, Section 1(j)(iv);

20 (B) The identification of revenue sources

21 to achieve the recommended level of permanent and

22 nonpermanent savings; and

23

1 (C) Policy criteria to guide the withdrawal

2 of nonpermanent savings.

3

4 (e) Legislative members of a task force created

5 pursuant to subsection (c) of this section shall receive

6 salary, per diem and mileage for traveling to and from and

7 attending meetings of the committees as if the task force

8 was an interim committee of the legislature. Members of the

9 public appointed to a task force who are not employed by

10 the state, shall receive the same per diem, expenses and

11 travel allowance as legislative members of the task force.

12

13 (f) The Vision 2020 advisory panel and all committees

14 or task forces appointed by the management council shall be

15 staffed by the legislative service office. Executive

16 branch agencies shall provide assistance to the committees,

17 task forces and advisory panel upon request.

18

19 (g) The management council may engage the services of

20 research firms, consulting expertise or University of

21 Wyoming personnel as necessary to carry out the purposes of

1 (h) Not later than October 1, 2015, each committee or

2 task force assigned a task by management council under

3 subsection (a) of this section shall submit a report of its

4 preliminary findings to the governor, management council

5 and the Vision 2020 advisory panel.

(j) Not later than September 1, 2016, each committee 7 8 or task force assigned a task by management council under subsection (a) of this section shall submit its final 9 10 report, findings, policy recommendations and recommended 11 statutory changes in draft form to the management council 12 and the Vision 2020 advisory panel. The management council 13 shall consolidate the reports, make final recommendations 14 to the legislature, state elected officials and any impacted state agency or institution and propose statutory 15 16 changes required to implement its recommendations not later

Section 2. There is appropriated three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative service office to carry out the purposes of this act. Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and 9-4-207(a), any unobligated, unexpended funds remaining in
