misrepresentation, including knowingly failing to properly 1 2 classify an individual as an employee, or knowingly fail to 3 disclose a material fact with the intention of preventing 4 or reducing the payment of benefits to any entitled individual, to avoid being subject to this act or to avoid 5 or reduce any contribution or other payment required from 6 an employing unit under this act, or willfully fail or 7 8 refuse to make any contribution or other payment. Any such individual violating this subsection is guilty of a 9 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 10 11 ninety (90) days, a fine of not more than seven hundred 12 fifty dollars (\$750.00), or both. Each false statement, 13 misrepresentation, failure to properly classify an individual as an employee or failure to disclose a material 14 fact is a separate offense. 15 16 17 27-14-510. Misrepresentations or false statements; failure of employer to establish account or furnish payroll 18 19 report. 20 21 (d) Any employer who knowingly fails to establish an 22 account or knowingly fails to furnish a payroll report, 23 including knowingly failing to properly classify an
