15	TRANSFER OF FEDERAL PUBLIC LANDS

1 2 36-12-201. Definitions 3 4 (a) As used in this article: 5 (i) "Governmental entity" means any federal, 6 state, local or other governmental unit, subdivision, 7 8 agency, department or instrumentality thereof; 9 (ii) "Net proceeds" means the proceeds from the 10 11 sale of public lands, after subtracting expenses incident 12 to the sale of the public lands; 13 (iii) "Public lands" means lands within the 14 exterior boundaries of Wyoming, except: 15 16 17 (A) Lands to which title is held by a person who is not a governmental entity; 18 19 20 (B) Lands owned or held in trust by the 21 state, a political subdivision of the state or an 22 independent entity; 23

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1 (C) Lands reserved for use by the state system of public education or a state institution of higher 2 3 education; 4 5 (D) School and institutional trust lands; 6 (E) The following national parks and other 7 8 areas: 9 10 (I) Yellowstone National Park; 11 12 (II) Grand Teton National Park; 13 14 (III) John D. Rockefeller, Jr. 15 Memorial Parkway; 16 17 (IV) Bighorn Canyon National 18 Recreation Area; 19 20 (V) Devils Tower National Monument; 21 22 Fort Laramie National Historic (VI) 23 Site; and

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1 2 (VII) Fossil Butte National Monument. 3 4 (F) Any other lands within the exterior 5 boundaries of Wyoming as of January 1, 2016, that are managed by the United States as a national park, designated 6 national monument or wilderness area designated under the 7 8 national wilderness preservation system; 9 10 (G) Real property or tangible personal 11 property owned by the United States if the property is 12 within the boundaries of a municipality; 13 14 (H) Any lands managed or owned by any 15 branch of the United States military or the United States 16 department of energy; or 17 18 Lands, including water (J) rights, 19 belonging to an Indian or Indian tribe, band or community 20 that is held in trust by the United States or is subject to 21 a restriction against alienation imposed by the United 22 States. 23

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1 36-12-202. Transfer of public lands. 2 3 (a) On or before December 31, 2018, the United States 4 shall: 5 (i) Extinguish title to all public lands; and 6 7 8 (ii) Transfer title to public lands to the state of Wyoming. 9 10 11 (b) If the state subsequently transfers title to any 12 public lands received under subsection (a) of this section, the state shall: 13 14 (i) Retain five percent (5%) of the net proceeds 15 16 the state receives from the transfer of title; and 17 (ii) Transfer ninety-five percent (95%) of the 18 19 net proceeds the state receives from the transfer of title 20 to the United States. 21 In accordance with the 22 (C) Wyoming state 23 constitution, the amount the state retains in accordance

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with paragraph (b)(i) of this section shall be deposited 1 2 into the permanent common school account within the 3 permanent land fund. 4 Section 2. 5 6 7 (a) There is created a joint select committee on the 8 transfer of public lands, with members as follows: 9 10 (i) The speaker of the house of representatives 11 shall appoint not more than three (3) members from the 12 majority party and not less than one (1) member from the 13 minority party of the house of representatives; and 14 15 (ii) The president of the senate shall appoint 16 not more than three (3) members from the majority party and not less than one (1) member from the minority party of the 17 18 senate. 19 20 (b) The committee shall choose its chair or cochairs 21 from among its membership. 22

1 (c) The committee shall, with guidance from other 2 interested parties and stakeholders, prepare proposed 3 legislation: 4 5 (i) Creating a public lands commission assigned 6 with: 7 8 (A) Administering the transfer of title of public lands to the state under W.S. 36-12-202; and 9 10 11 (B) Addressing the management of public lands and the management of multiple uses of public lands 12 and recognizing all existing rights. 13 14 (ii) Establishing actions that shall be taken to 15 16 secure, preserve and protect the state's rights and 17 benefits related to the United States' duty to have extinguished title to public lands under W.S. 36-12-202 in 18 19 the event that the United States does not meet the 20 requirements of W.S. 36-12-202; 21

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1 (iii) Recommending any necessary modifications to the definition of "public lands" as provided in W.S. 2 3 36-12-201(a)(iii); 4 5 (iv) Making a determination of, or creating a process for determining, interests, rights or uses related 6 7 to: 8 9 (A) Easements; 10 11 (B) Geothermal resources; 12 13 (C) Grazing; 14 15 (D) Mining; 16 17 (E) Natural gas; 18 19 (F) Oil and other fossil fuels; 20 21 (G) Recreation; 22 23 (H) Rights of entry;

1 2 (J) Special uses; 3 4 (K) Timber; 5 6 Water; (M) 7 8 (N) Hunting and fishing; or 9 (0) Other natural resources or other 10 11 resources. 12 (v) Determining what constitutes "expenses 13 incident to the sale of public lands" as provided in the 14 definition of "net proceeds" under W.S. 36-12-201(a)(ii). 15 16 17 (d) The joint select committee on the transfer of public lands shall also study and determine whether to 18 19 prepare proposed legislation related to: 20 21 (i) Establishing an administrative process for: 22

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1 (A) The United States to extinguish title 2 to public lands; 3 4 (B) The state to receive title to public 5 lands from the United States; or 6 7 (C) The state to transfer title to any 8 public lands the state receives in accordance with W.S. 36-12-202. 9 10 11 (ii) Establishing a prioritized list of 12 management actions for the state and the political subdivisions of the state to perform on public lands: 13 14 15 (A) Before and after the United States 16 extinguishes title to public lands under W.S. 36-12-202; 17 and 18 19 (B) To preserve and promote the state's 20 interest in: 21 22 (I) Protecting public health and 23 safety;

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1 2 (II) Preventing catastrophic wildfire 3 and forest insect infestation; 4 5 (III) Preserving watersheds; 6 7 (IV) Preserving and enhancing energy 8 and the production of minerals; 9 10 (V) Preserving and improving range 11 conditions; 12 13 (VI) Increasing plant diversity and reducing invasive weeds on range and woodland portions of 14 the public lands; and 15 16 17 (VII) Providing for no net loss of public access for hunting and fishing and other outdoor 18 19 recreational purposes. 20 21 (iii) Establishing procedures and requirements for subjecting public lands to property taxation; 22 23

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1 (iv) Establishing other requirements related to 2 national forests, national recreation areas or other public 3 lands administered by the United States; and 4 5 indemnification (v) Addressing the of а political subdivision of the state for actions taken in 6 furtherance of W.S. 36-12-202. 7 8 9 The joint select committee on the transfer of (e) 10 public lands also may study any other issue related to public lands as recommended by the governor. 11 12 13 (f) The joint select committee on the transfer of 14 public lands shall: 15 16 (i) Make preliminary reports on the study and preparation of proposed legislation required under this 17 section to the legislature by June 30, 2017 and by October 18 19 31, 2017; and 20 (ii) Deliver a final report containing findings, 21 22 recommendations and proposed legislation to the legislature 23 not later than January 2, 2018.

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1 2 (g) The select committee shall be staffed by the 3 legislative service office. The office of state lands and 4 investments and the attorney general shall serve in an 5 advisory capacity to the task force and shall provide technical and other relevant information as requested. 6 7 8 Members of the joint select committee on the (h) 9 transfer of public lands shall be paid salary, per diem and mileage as provided in W.S. 28-5-101 for their official 10 11 duties as members of the select committee. 12 13 Section 3. 14 15 (a) The legislature finds that federal funding and 16 the resulting capacity for responsible management of federal public lands are in serious jeopardy while critical 17 threats such as beetle kills, invasive species, watershed 18 19 degradation, access restrictions and catastrophic wildfires 20 continue to escalate. 21 22 (b) The legislature further finds that the enabling

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act creating the state of Wyoming includes

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provisions for the disposal of public lands and guarantees 1 2 admittance into the union on equal footing with all other 3 states. Wyoming, like other western states, has not 4 received the full benefit of the provisions of the enabling act, related to the disposal of lands from the federal 5 government. More specifically, section 7 of the act of 6 admission requires "Five percent of the proceeds of the 7 8 sales of public lands lying within said state shall be paid to the said state for the support of the common 9 schools within said state." 10

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Section 4. There is appropriated twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative service office. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2018. This appropriation shall only be expended for payment of salary, per diem and mileage for legislative select committee members.

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Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon
completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
Constitution.
