5. The public health laboratory is authorized to charge fees for testing services provided to other state agencies, local law enforcement entities and other individuals or organizations. The department is authorized to deposit all fees received pursuant to this footnote into a special revenue account. The department shall not charge fees until it has promulgated rules establishing a fee schedule. Fees shall be set in an amount sufficient to recoup the department's cost of providing services. No monies deposited into this account shall be expended until appropriated by the legislature. The public health laboratory shall make its
