A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to highways; specifying that requirements
- 2 for county bridge designs, plans and specifications apply
- 3 to cities and towns; requiring notice to the department of
- 4 transportation of a constructed bridge; eliminating
- 5 department of transportation preapproval of bridge designs,
- 6 plans and specifications for counties, cities and towns;
- 7 and providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 24-1-132(a), (c) through (g) and
- 12 24-2-106(a)(iii) are amended to read:

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- 24-1-132. Contracts for county, city and town bridge
- work; bids; exception.

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2 The board of county commissioners of any county 3 or governing body of any city or town shall cause to be 4 prepared comprehensive plans and specifications for the 5 construction of bridges any bridge on any dedicated and 6 maintained county road in its jurisdiction.

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When any bridge is to be constructed, which 9 includes either new construction or reconstruction of major 10 load carrying bridge components, upon any county road in a county's, city's or town's jurisdiction, the estimated cost 11 12 which shall exceed twenty-five thousand 13 (\$25,000.00), the construction work shall be competitively 14 bid and the bridge work constructed by contract. No 15 contract shall be divided for the purpose of avoiding 16 competitive bidding. The construction work may be described 17 in the published call for bids by stating general requirements. Detailed specifications shall be available to 19 prospective bidders at the county commissioner's office or 20 offices of the governing body of the city or town.

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22 All bridges to be constructed shall be designed 23 by a professional engineer who holds a valid certificate of

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registration license granted by the state board of 1 2 examining engineers of the state of Wyoming. Plans and 3 specifications shall be prepared in accordance with the 4 provisions of W.S. 24-2-106 board of professional engineers 5 and professional land surveyors. 6 (e) The board of county commissioners of any county 7 8 or governing body of any city or town shall cause notices 9 of the contract to be let to be published for two (2) 10 consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation within the state and to take any other means available to 11 12 achieve as wide a notice as possible, but in no case shall 13 any letting of the contract be held within fifteen (15) days of the last published notice. 14 15 16 (f) All contracts shall be awarded by 17 governing body of the city or town shall award any contract 18 to the lowest responsible bidder. The county commissioners 19 20 shall reserve or governing body reserves the right to 21 reject any and all bids bid and to waive irregularities and informalities in the bidding. No final payment upon any 22

contract shall be made until the bridge is examined and

approved by the professional engineer supervising the 1 2 construction of the bridge and the payment is approved by 3 the county commissioners or governing body of the city or 4 town or their designees. Within ninety (90) days of the 5 bridge being opened to traffic the board of county 6 commissioners or governing body of the city or town shall notify and provide the design, plans, specifications and 7 8 load rating for the bridge to the chief engineer of the 9 department of transportation so that the department may 10 comply with national bridge inspection standards.

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12 emergency arises (a) Whenever an requiring 13 expenditure of funds for the repair or rebuilding of 14 bridges or approaches to bridges the board of county commissioners or governing body of any city or town may 15 16 enter into contract for any building or rebuilding of bridges or approaches without advertising for the letting 17 of any contract. An emergency is an occasion requiring 18 19 repair or rebuilding of a bridge or a portion of a bridge 20 when, on short notice, the bridge has become unsafe or 21 impassable due to events which are beyond the control of 22 the county, city or town.
