1 (a) As used in this section: 2 3 4 (vi) "Successive education" means the pursuit of a degree or certificate at a higher level than the student 5 6 has previously earned using benefits received under this 7 section. 8 9 any political educational (b) The state or 10 subdivision shall provide free tuition, matriculation and other fees to all eligible persons who are residents of 11 12 this state and who are attending or may attend any state 13 institutions in elementary, secondary and college grades, 14 business colleges, state vocational training schools or 15 other educational institutions of this state the University 16 of Wyoming or a Wyoming community college for the purpose of successive education, where courses of instruction are 17 18 provided in subjects which would tend to enable the 19 eligible persons to engage in any useful trade, occupation 20 or profession. Funds provided under this section shall not exceed the University of Wyoming current undergraduate rate 21 22 per semester, regardless of the education level, degree or

2 The community college commission shall reimburse 3 the University of Wyoming and each community college for 4 the costs of tuition and fees provided under this section. 5 If insufficient funds are appropriated, the reimbursement shall be proportionally reduced based on tuition and fee 6 expenses. The commission shall promulgate rules for the 7 8 implementation of the free tuition and fees pursuant to subsections (f) through (k) of this section, including the 9 10 reimbursement to the university and community colleges.

12 (f) Any person who is a Vietnam veteran, 13 presently receiving education benefits under the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, as amended, an 14 15 overseas combat veteran, a combat veteran surviving spouse 16 or a combat veteran dependent shall receive free tuition 17 and fees for up to a total of ten (10) eight (8) semesters of study at the University of Wyoming or any Wyoming 18 19 community college. The University of Wyoming and all 20 Wyoming community colleges shall cooperate to ensure that a 21 total of not more than $\frac{\text{ten}}{\text{(10)}}$ eight (8) semesters is provided under this section to any recipient. No person 22 23 shall be eligible for the benefits provided under this

- section for any semester commencing more than eight (8)

 academic years after the semester in which the person

 initially receives benefits under this section. The

 institution in which the student enrolls shall grant
- 5 exceptions to the requirements of this subsection for
- 6 military service, religious service or other good cause
- 7 shown, which exceptions shall be consistent with rules
- 8 promulgated by the Wyoming department of education for the
- 9 Hathaway scholarship program under W.S. 21-16-1303(d).

11 (j) A person who had qualified for free tuition and 12 fees—under subsection (f) or (q) of this section, shall be 13 deemed eligible for the free tuition and fees at any 14 Wyoming community college or the University of Wyoming up 15 to the maximum number of semesters of study allowed under 16 subsection $\frac{(a)}{(b)}$ of this section, if the person transfers to another institution specified in subsection $\frac{a}{b}$ of 17 18 this section.

20 (k) To remain eligible for benefits under this 21 section, by the end of the spring semester completing the 22 student's third or fourth semester of attendance, the 23 student shall have a cumulative grade point average of at

1	least two point zero (2.0) and shall maintain a cumulative
2	grade point average of at least two point zero (2.0) at the
3	end of each subsequent spring semester to continue to
4	receive the free tuition . and fees.

6	Section 2. Notwithstanding W.S. 19-14-106 as amended
7	by this act, students receiving initial benefits before
8	July 1, 2018, shall be eligible for free tuition and fees
9	for up to a total of ten (10) semesters if such benefits
10	are exercised before August 15, 2020. Students receiving
11	benefits subject to this section may continue work in the
12	certificate or degree based program in which they are
13	currently enrolled regardless of successive education or
14	University of Wyoming undergraduate rate requirements.
15	
16	Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2018.
