1 AN ACT relating to anatomical gifts; requiring training on

2 the Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act for coroners and

3 district attorneys; specifying that autopsies or postmortem

4 examinations shall comply with Revised Uniform Anatomical

5 Gift Act requirements; and providing for an effective date.

9 **Section 1.** W.S. 7-4-103(a) by creating a new

Certification requirements; penalty; 2 expenses. 3 4 (a) After January 5, 1987, no person shall continue 5 in office as county coroner or deputy coroner unless he has been certified under W.S. 9-1-634 as having completed: 6 7 8 (iii) Not less than four (4) hours of training 9 on the Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act, W.S. 35-5-201 10 through 35-5-225. Training shall be obtained from a Wyoming 11 organ procurement organization, including an eye bank 12 serving Wyoming, proficient in the requirements of organ, 13 eye and tissue donation. 14 7-4-201. Reports of death; investigation; summoning 15 16 of jurors; fees and costs; inspection of medical records. 17 (b) When the coroner is notified that the dead body 18 19 of any person has been found within the limits of the 20 county or that the death resulted from injury sustained 21 within the county and he suspects that the death is a 22 coroner's case, he shall conduct an investigation which may include: 23

Created; membership; removal; compensation; 2 meetings; publication of procedures; standards for 3 certified training; powers and duties. 4 5 The commission shall cooperate with the board of coroner standards to establish course requirements and 6 continuing education requirements for coroner training. 7 8 Requirements shall include training pursuant to W.S. 9 7-4-103 (a) (iii). 10 11 9-1-804. Duties and powers generally; employment of 12 deputy and assistant district attorneys and other necessary 13 personnel. 14 15 (d) Each district attorney shall complete and certify 16 that each deputy, assistant and part-time district attorney completes not less than four (4) hours of training on the 17 18 Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act, W.S. 35-5-201 through 19 35-5-225. Training shall be obtained from a Wyoming organ 20 procurement organization, including an eye bank serving Wyoming, proficient in the requirements of organ, eye and 21 tissue donation. 22

3 The medical certification shall be completed and 4 signed within a reasonable time after death by the primary health care provider in charge of the patient's care for 5 the illness or condition which resulted in death, except 6 when inquiry is required by the postmortem examination. If 7 8 the death occurred without medical attendance or if the primary health care provider last in attendance refuses or 9 10 for any reason fails to sign the certificate immediately, the funeral director or person acting as funeral director 11 12 shall notify the appropriate local registrar. In that event 13 the local registrar shall inform the local health officer 14 and refer the case to him for immediate investigation and certification of cause of death prior to issuing a permit 15 16 for burial, cremation or other disposition of the body. If the circumstances of the case suggest that the death was 17 18 caused by other than natural causes, the local registrar 19 shall refer the case to the coroner for investigation and 20 certification. The coroner shall examine the body and 21 consider the history of the case, and obtain the assistance and advice of a competent physician who will assist the 22 23 coroner in determining the cause of death by examination of

- 1 the body, autopsy, inquest or other procedure determined
- 2 necessary and in a manner compatible with anatomical gift
- 3 preservation according to W.S. 35-5-221 and 35-5-222. The
- 4 nonmedical coroner shall not diagnose the cause of death
- 5 without the assistance and advice of a competent physician,
- 6 advanced practice registered nurse or physician assistant.
- 7 The coroner or local health officer shall complete and sign
- 8 the medical certification within a reasonable time after
- 9 taking charge of the case.

- 14 (b) If a coroner receives notice from a procurement
- 15 organization that an anatomical gift might be available or
- 16 was made with respect to a decedent whose body is under the
- 17 jurisdiction of the coroner and a post-mortem examination
- 18 is going to be performed pursuant to W.S. 7-4-209, unless
- 19 the coroner denies recovery in accordance with
- 20 W.S. 35-5-222, the coroner or designee shall conduct a
- 21 post-mortem examination of the body or the part in a manner
- 22 and within a period compatible with its preservation for

5	(f) The coroner and procurement organization shall
6	enter into an agreement establishing protocols and
7	procedures governing relations between them when the
8	coroner believes that the recovery of a part for anatomical
9	gift from a decedent whose body is under the jurisdiction
10	of the coroner could interfere with the post-mortem
11	investigation into the decedent's cause or manner of death
12	conducted pursuant to W.S. 7-4-209 or the documentation or
13	preservation of evidence. Decisions regarding the recovery
14	of a part from the decedent shall be made in accordance
15	with the agreement.

17	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2018.
