School finance recalibration-transportation.

A BILL

AN ACT relating to school finance; requiring the department
of education to evaluate and provide recommendations on
fiscal efficiencies in transportation funding; requiring
reports; and providing for an effective date.
Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 Section 1.

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10 (a) The legislature recognizes the importance 11 effective transportation plays in ensuring all students in 12 the state have an equal opportunity to receive a quality 13 education. The legislature also recognizes the state has an 14 interest in ensuring public school transportation is funded 15 in a cost effective manner. The department of education

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shall evaluate the transportation funding system in place 1 2 prior to the enactment of 2017 Wyoming Session Laws, 3 Chapter 205, identify fiscal efficiencies within the system 4 and provide recommendations for how to implement those 5 efficiencies through statute or rule. In this study, the department shall evaluate and provide recommendations on: 6 7 8 (i) Existing department rules on minimum student 9 walking distances; 10 11 (ii) Existing department rules relating to 12 physical barriers and safety hazards within walking zones. The department shall evaluate school districts' methods of 13 evaluating physical barriers and safety hazards and school 14 districts' methods for confirming those designations; 15 16 17 The sharing of transportation personnel (iii) and services among school districts, including department 18 19 rules on sharing transportation services; 20 21 (iv) The use of contracts with parents and 22 guardians to provide compensation for transportation of 23 students;

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1 2 (v) Existing department rules on what a school 3 district must demonstrate to the department in order to 4 increase the size of its bus fleet. The department shall consider: 5 6 7 (A) How the rules could be developed to 8 enhance school bus routing efficiency; and 9 (B) How the rules could be developed to 10 enhance transportation efficiencies by using buses with 11 12 greater seating capacity. 13 14 (vi) Existing department rules on school bus 15 life cycles; 16 17 (vii) Existing department rules on the review of a school district's fleet when a district's average daily 18 membership decreases by fifteen percent (15%) or more in a 19 20 three (3) year period; 21 22 (viii) Existing department rules on allowable 23 and nonallowable costs;

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1 2 (ix) Opportunities to reduce the number of 3 school district buses. The department shall identify 4 circumstances where school districts may adopt multiple 5 routing, including circumstances where adjustment of school 6 schedules would allow use of multiple routing; 7 8 (X) Incentives for school districts to adopt and 9 modern school transportation routing use software, navigation systems and related programs and training; 10 11 12 (xi) Any other mechanism in the state's 13 transportation funding system that would increase efficiencies; 14 15 16 (xii) Possible use of regional transportation service districts to provide cost savings and improve 17 efficiency for school district transportation operations; 18 19 20 (xiii) Opportunities to phase in school buses 21 equipped with seat belts. 22

1 (b) To the extent the department determines regional 2 meetings of school districts around the state are necessary 3 complete the requirements of this section, the to 4 department is authorized to conduct the meetings. 5 Appropriate school district personnel shall attend regional meetings at the request of the department. 6 7 8 (C) The department of education may request any executive branch agency or any school district of the state 9 10 to provide information necessary to the department in its 11 studies. Agencies and school districts shall comply 12 promptly with any request. 13 14 2. Not later than June Section 1, 2018, the department of education shall report to the joint education 15 16 interim committee its preliminary evaluation and 17 recommendations on the studies conducted pursuant to 18 section 1 of this act. Not later than September 1, 2018, the department shall report its final evaluation and 19 20 recommendations to the joint education interim committee. 21

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Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
