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1 (a) A school district is authorized to take the 2 following actions relating to child sexual abuse education, 3 prevention and response: 4 5 (i) Provide parents with information on the warning signs of child sexual abuse and any available 6 resources for education, prevention and response; 7 8 9 (ii) Provide training to teachers and other school district employees, including: 10 11 12 (A) Instructional methods relating to the provisions of W.S. 21-9-104; 13 14 15 (B) Child abuse or neglect reporting 16 requirements specified in W.S. 14-3-205; 17 18 (C) Methods to respond to a student's 19 disclosure of sexual abuse in a supportive and appropriate 20 manner. 21 22 (iii) Consult with federal, state and local entities and community based organizations, including the 23

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child welfare information gateway internet website 1 2 maintained by the United States department of health and 3 human services, to identify evidence based tools and 4 programs to prevent and respond to child sexual abuse; 5 (iv) Develop community based strategies to 6 promote education, collaboration and accountability among 7 8 persons and entities who are responsible for child sexual abuse education, prevention and response, including parents 9 10 and guardians, law enforcement, judicial officers, health care providers and other members of the community; 11 12 13 (v) Accept funds from private and public sources 14 for programs relating to this section. 15 16 21-9-104. Child sexual abuse prevention instruction. 17 18 (a) This section may be cited as "Erin's Law." 19 20 (b) A school district may include child sexual abuse 21 prevention instruction in a health and safety program required under W.S. 21-9-101(b)(i)(G). A school district 22 23 may provide instruction under this subsection in any 3

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appropriate manner, which may include age appropriate, 1 evidence based instruction on: 2 3 4 (i) Recognizing sexual abuse and assault; 5 6 (ii) Personal boundary violations; 7 8 (iii) Ways in which a sexual offender may groom or desensitize a victim; 9 10 11 (iv) Strategies relating to: 12 13 (A) Disclosure of child sexual abuse; 14 15 (B) Reducing self blame; 16 17 (C) Mobilizing bystanders to respond to child sexual abuse. 18 19 20 Section 2.
