Medicare discrimination.

A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to the provision of health care; requiring 1 2 a study of discrimination by the federal Medicare program against Wyoming residents and Wyoming health care 3 providers; requiring a study of Medicare reimbursement 4 5 rates and related health and health care impacts; requiring 6 a study of the economic impacts of Medicare reimbursement 7 rates; assigning duties to the governor, the state health officer, the department of health, the board of medicine, 8 the Wyoming business council and the Wyoming attorney 9 general; enabling the governor to create a steering 10 committee to coordinate study activities; providing a 11 sunset date; providing an appropriation; and providing for 12 13 an effective date.

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15 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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1 2 Section 1. 3 4 (a) The following persons shall provide reports and analyses for inclusion in the final report required by this 5 6 section: 7 8 (i) With assistance from department of health staff, the department of health shall, based on its 9 10 professional knowledge and other reliable research, prepare 11 a report analyzing the following issues: 12 13 (A) The effect on Wyoming patients in terms 14 of mortality, morbidity and general well-being of receiving 15 medical care in their home community, as opposed to 16 receiving care in a distant location; 17 18 Identification of the most common, 19 serious medical conditions treated in Wyoming's larger 20 communities and identification of those medical conditions 21 which pose significant mortality or morbidity risks if 22 treatment becomes unavailable in a Wyoming community and a 23 patient is required to travel elsewhere to obtain the

treatment. Consideration shall be given to the risks of

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2 both travel time under normal travel conditions and travel 3 when weather or other factors delay or temporarily prevent 4 safe travel; 5 (C) Identification of those 6 treatments identified in subparagraph (B) of this paragraph 7 8 which are at risk of being discontinued due to Medicare discrimination or low reimbursements. The department of 9 10 health may request assistance from the Wyoming business 11 council in analyzing the economic issues involved in this 12 determination. 13 14 its experience and knowledge (ii) Based on recruiting physicians and other health care providers to 15 16 Wyoming, the department of health shall provide a statement, accompanied by available data and analysis, 17 explaining any difficulties in recruiting physicians and 18 19 other health care providers created by low reimbursements 20 in general, and low Medicare reimbursements in particular; 21 22 (iii) The Wyoming business council shall analyze 23 the following issues:

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1 2 (A) Identify the cost shift in the 3 noncritical hospital access context to commercial insurers, 4 self-insured businesses and private payors caused by Medicare and other payors who reimburse or pay less than 5 the costs incurred by a health care provider or hospital in 6 providing a service; 7 8 9 (B) Identify how actual costs and charges 10 paid in Wyoming by Medicare and by commercial insurers 11 compare to similar payments made in surrounding states, either for all procedures or for those where a patient is 12 13 most likely to receive the procedure out-of-state; 14 15 Identify or estimate total health care (C) 16 spending for all Wyoming residents and identify how much of that spending occurs outside of Wyoming. Identify whether 17 18 the percentage of out-of-state spending is likely to change 19 and, if so, the likely reasons for the change; 20 21 Identify what types of medical care, if (D) 22 any, may become no longer economically viable in Wyoming as

a result of out-of-state competition. With assistance from

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- 1 the department of health, identify the health risks to
- 2 Wyoming residents which may result from any reduction in
- 3 the identified types of medical care.

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- 5 (iv) The board of medicine shall provide a
- 6 report, and provide copies to the department of health and
- 7 the Wyoming business council, listing the areas of medical
- 8 practice that it believes may be at risk of ending or
- 9 becoming significantly limited in Wyoming, or that may end
- 10 or become significantly limited in a major portion of
- 11 Wyoming, as a result of out-of-state competition. The
- 12 board shall base its report on its experience with
- 13 professional licensure requests and the personal judgment
- 14 of its members;

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- 16 (v) The attorney general shall consider and
- 17 report to the governor on the following:

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- 19 (A) Whether legal action over Medicare's
- 20 low and discriminatory reimbursement practices in Wyoming
- 21 could provide relief from the problems created by the low
- 22 and discriminatory reimbursement practices. The attorney

- 1 general shall provide information about the identity of the
- 2 proper plaintiff in any legal action;

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- 4 (B) Whether legal precedents supporting
- 5 public utility rate regulation and other regulatory
- 6 mechanisms have or could have any application to Medicare
- 7 reimbursement rates and could serve as a basis for
- 8 regulating Medicare reimbursement in Wyoming or requiring
- 9 fair Medicare reimbursement rates;

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- 11 (C) The report required by this paragraph
- 12 does not require a definitive answer on the subjects
- 13 reported, but does seek a recommendation as to whether the
- 14 state should spend the resources necessary to more fully
- 15 determine if legal action should be pursued.

- 17 (b) The governor shall compile the reports and
- 18 analyses required by subsection (a) of this section,
- 19 together with any recommendations that he may have, into a
- 20 single report that shall be provided to the joint labor,
- 21 health and social services interim committee, the joint
- 22 appropriations committee and to the legislative service
- 23 office on or before November 1, 2018. The governor shall

1 determine if the report will be a final report, or if the

2 report shall be a preliminary report with a final report to

3 be submitted on or before November 1, 2019. In preparing

4 the report, the governor may include or exclude any portion

5 of the analysis provided by the attorney general under

6 paragraph (a) (v) of this section in order to comply with

7 the law or not jeopardize any legal claim recommended by

8 the attorney general.

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10 Section 2.

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12 (a) The governor:

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14 (i) May create a steering committee with a

15 membership he deems appropriate to advise on the issues

16 identified in section 1 of this act and to help direct any

17 of the duties imposed by section 1 of this act;

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19 (ii) May assign to the steering committee or any

20 state agency he deems appropriate the task of managing the

21 development of the reports required by section 1 of this

22 act.

| 1 | Section 3. There is appropriated fifty thousand |
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| 2 | dollars (\$50,000.00) from the general fund to the governor. |
| 3 | This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with |
| 4 | the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2020. |
| 5 | This appropriation shall only be expended for the hiring of |
| 6 | consultant services deemed by the governor to be useful in |
| 7 | researching, developing and presenting the analyses and |
| 8 | reports required by this act, and for assembling, |
| 9 | reproducing and distributing the final report. |
| 10 | Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this |
| 11 | appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any |
| 12 | other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds |
| 13 | remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided |
| 14 | by law on June 30, 2020. |
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| 16 | Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon |
| 17 | completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law |
| 18 | as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming |
| 19 | Constitution. |
