1 economic diversification ACT relating to ΑN development; modifying membership and authority of the 2 economically needed diversity options for Wyoming (ENDOW) 3 executive council; expanding agriculture marketing program 4 within the Wyoming business council; providing for 5 international trade representatives; specifying additional 6 economic diversification and development studies; providing 7 8 for subaccounts within the economic diversification 9 account; providing appropriations; modifying other appropriations; and providing for an effective date. 10

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12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 14 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-12-105(a) (vii), 9-12-109,
- 9-12-1401(a), 9-12-1402(a) by creating a new paragraph
- 16 (xii) and 9-12-1404 are amended to read:

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2	9-12-105. Economic development services.
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4	(a) It shall be the duty of the council to encourage,
5	stimulate and support the development and expansion of the
6	economy of the state. The council is charged with the
7	following duties and responsibilities:
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9	(vii) To encourage the export of products and
10	services from the state to national and international
11	markets. In addition to conducting international and other
12	market research as authorized in W.S. 9-12-106(b), the
13	council shall employ or contract with persons for purposes
14	of developing new markets and expanding foreign trade
15	efforts, including expanding international markets for
16	Wyoming services, Wyoming agricultural and other products
17	and commodities, and targeted consumer advertising; and
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19	9-12-109. Promotion of agriculture.
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21	(a) The council shall encourage and promote the
22	development of agriculture in the state including
23	horticulture, apiculture, livestock, poultry, dairying and

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1	the kindred industries and including the development of new
2	value-added agribusiness and product uses and markets for

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5	(b) The council shall solicit input from industry
6	groups and in consultation with the economically needed
7	diversity options for Wyoming (ENDOW) executive council:

12	sized processing plants for international sales;

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9-12-1401. Economically needed diversity options for
Wyoming executive council; creation; appointment and terms
of members.

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5 the economically needed (a) There is created diversity options for Wyoming (ENDOW) executive council. 6 The members shall represent existing, new and emerging 7 8 economic sectors or subsectors or have demonstrated 9 executive level experience. The council shall consist of 10 not more than fifteen (15) twenty (20) voting members, 11 appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of 12 the senate. The presiding officers of the house and senate 13 and the chairmen of the house and senate minerals, business 14 and economic development committees shall be ex officio, 15 nonvoting members. The governor may remove any appointed 16 member as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. If an appointed 17 member's position is vacant the governor shall appoint a 18 new member as provided in W.S. 28-12-101. The governor, or 19 his designee, shall be a member and cochairman chairman of 20 the council, but shall not vote. The council shall elect a 21 cochairman vice-chairman from among the appointed members. One-half plus one (1) of the appointed members shall have 22 23 initial terms of four (4) years and the remaining members

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shall have initial terms of two (2) years. Thereafter,
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    appointed members shall serve for terms of four (4) years.

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1 9-12-1404. Economic diversification account created; 2 authorized expenditures. 3 4 (a) There is created an economic diversification 5 account. All monies in the account are continuously appropriated to the office of the governor to be used 6 solely for the purposes of this article and as otherwise 7 8 specified by law, including per diem, mileage and other administrative expenses of the ENDOW executive council. 9 Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008 and 9-4-207, funds in the 10 account shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal period. 11 12 Interest earned on funds in the account shall be deposited 13 to the account. Within the account shall be subaccounts. For accounting and investment purposes only all subaccounts 14 shall be treated as separate accounts. Subaccounts are as 15 16 follows: 17 18 (i) The agriculture marketing subaccount. Funds 19 within this subaccount may be expended as requested by the 20 Wyoming business council and approved by the governor or 21 his designee to provide funding for purposes of W.S. 22 9-12-109.

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(b) The governor may accept, and shall deposit to the 1 2 account, or to the appropriate subaccount within the 3 account, any gifts, contributions, donations, grants or 4 federal funds specifically designated for purposes of this article or other ENDOW related program. 5 6 7 Section 2. Notwithstanding W.S. 9-12-1401(a), of the 8 additional five (5) members appointed to the ENDOW council 9 pursuant to this act, two (2) members shall be appointed 10 for an initial term ending March 31, 2021 and three (3) members shall be appointed for an initial term ending March 11 12 31, 2023. 13 Section 3. 14 15 16 There is appropriated four hundred thousand (a) dollars (\$400,000.00) from the general fund to the Wyoming 17 business council to conduct international marketing and 18 19 trade activities authorized under W.S. 9-12-105(a)(vii) and 20 9-12-106(b). Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 21 funds appropriated under this subsection shall not be

transferred or expended for any other purpose. Unobligated,

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unencumbered funds appropriated in this subsection shall 1 2 revert on June 30, 2020. 3 4 (b) There is appropriated from the legislative 5 stabilization reserve account two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) to the agricultural marketing subaccount 6 within the economic diversification account created in W.S. 7 8 9-12-1404(a)(i). Upon the effective date of this act: 9 (i) The appropriation contained in 2018 House 10 11 0001, section 321(a)(ii) to the economic Bill 12 diversification account created by W.S. 9-12-1404(a) shall be reduced two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00); and 13 14 (ii) 2018 House Bill 0001, section 321(a)(ii)(A) 15 16 introductory subparagraph and subdivisions (A)(I) through (III) shall not be effective. 17

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Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
