- 3 providing for a study of retirement preparedness and

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9 Section 1.

- 11 (a) There is created the retirement income security
- 12 task force consisting of the following members:

14 (i) The state treasurer or his designee;

1 (ii) The director of the Wyoming department of 2 workforce services or his designee; 3 4 (iii) The cochairman elected pursuant to W.S. 5 9-12-1401(a) from among the appointed members of the economically needed diversity options for Wyoming (ENDOW) 6 7 executive council or his designee; 8 9 (iv) One (1) person appointed by the Wyoming state office of the American association of 10 retired 11 persons; 12 (v) One (1) representative of the Wyoming 13 business community, appointed by the state treasurer; 14 15 16 (vi) One (1) representative of a nonprofit 17 organization in Wyoming, appointed by the state treasurer; 18

(vii) One (1) representative of the financial

L3	(c) The task force shall be staffed by the state
L 4	retirement system. State agencies shall provide information
L5	and assistance to the task force as requested by the task
L 6	force.

L8	(d) The task force shall identify, study and make
L 9	recommendations concerning:

21	(i) The preparedness of Wyoming residents to
22	retire in a financially secure manner, including an
23	evaluation of options, processes and any legislative

proposals necessary to implement a state operated, 1 2 privately operated or jointly operated retirement savings 3 program for private sector employees having limited or no 4 access to a retirement savings program at their places of 5 employment; 6 7 (ii) The number of employees in the state 8 currently not participating in an employer sponsored 9 retirement savings plan or program; 10 11 (iii) The establishment and operation of high 12 quality and low cost retirement income security plans or programs that are governed by federal law and that qualify 13 for tax favored treatment under the tax codes of the United 14 15 States and Wyoming. The task force shall consult with 16 experts from the private and nonprofit sectors 17 considering the issues listed in this paragraph; 18

1 (v) The costs to employers for participation in 2 a statewide retirement savings plan or retirement income 3 security plan; 4 (vi) The effects of implementing a statewide 5 retirement income security plan on economic activity in the 6 7 state; 8 9 (vii) Other programs and incentives that may be 10 available to increase the percentage of financially secure 11 retirees in Wyoming; 12 13 (viii) The financial impact to the state's social safety net programs and general fund if the state 14 15 fails to act to improve citizen access to retirement 16 savings opportunities at their places of employment. 17 18 (e) The task force shall submit a report summarizing 19 its studies, findings, recommendations and any proposals 20 for appropriate legislation to the joint labor, health and 21 social services interim committee on or before December 1, 2018. The joint labor, health and social services interim 22 committee shall consider the recommendations and develop 23

- 1 any legislation it deems appropriate for consideration by
- 2 the legislature. If the recommendations made by the task
- 3 force suggest a multi-year approach to addressing the
- 4 issues identified in this act, the joint labor, health and
- 5 social services interim committee may consider sponsoring
- 6 legislation for the continuation of the task force.

- 8 (f) The task force shall terminate on December 1,
- 9 2018.

11 Section 2.

- 13 (a) There is appropriated seven thousand dollars
- 14 (\$7,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative
- 15 service office. This appropriation shall be for the period
- 16 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending
- 17 June 30, 2019. This appropriation shall only be expended
- 18 for the purpose of funding salary, mileage and per diem of
- 19 legislative members of the task force. Notwithstanding any
- 20 other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be
- 21 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any
- 22 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

1 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

2019.

4 (b) There is appropriated thirteen thousand dollars 5 (\$13,000.00) from the general fund to the state retirement

6 system. This appropriation shall be for the period

7 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending

8 June 30, 2019. This appropriation shall only be expended

 $\,9\,$ for the purpose of funding mileage and per diem for the

10 members of the task force appointed by the governor who are

11 not state employees. Notwithstanding any other provision of

12 law, this appropriation shall not be transferred or

13 expended for any other purpose and any unexpended,

14 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall

15 revert as provided by law on June 30, 2019.

16

Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

20 Constitution.
