A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to agriculture; amending provisions for the 1 2 general supervision, operation and maintenance of the annual state fair and fairgrounds; amending the purpose of 3 the state fair; reconstituting the state fair advisory 4 5 board as the state fair board; specifying composition of 6 the state fair board; specifying duties of the state fair 7 board, the department of agriculture, the Wyoming tourism 8 board and the state construction department; making conforming amendments; providing an appropriation; and 9 10 providing for an effective date.

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12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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14 Section 1. W.S. 11-10-101, 11-10-102, 11-10-104

15 through 11-10-108 and 11-10-115 are amended to read:

2 11-10-101. Annual state fair; where held; purpose.

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4 The state fair board, with the assistance of the department 5 of agriculture, shall hold an annual state fair at Douglas, Wyoming, where all important products of the state shall be 6 recognized according to merit by premiums or rewards for 7 8 excellence offered out of an appropriation provided by the 9 legislature. No person shall collect any award until he 10 furnishes to the department a complete history in writing 11 of how the exhibit was produced and all other information 12 concerning the entry that would be of interest or benefit 13 to dedicated to honoring Wyoming's agricultural heritage and culture by cultivating Wyoming's agricultural future 14 15 through competitions, educational displays and experiential

exhibits for youth producers and the general public.

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21 <u>(a)</u> The general charge and supervision of the state
22 fair is under the <u>director of state fair board with the</u>
23 <u>assistance of the department of agriculture. The director</u>

1	may employ a competent manager and other employees
2	necessary for the proper conduct and management of the fair
3	and fairgrounds.
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5	(b) The department shall prepare budget requests on
6	behalf of and subject to the approval of the state fair
7	board for the conduct and management of the annual state
8	fair and for the operation and maintenance of the state
9	fairgrounds, including building and facility needs for
10	major maintenance and repair. The director is responsible
11	for the proper disbursement of all funds appropriated for
12	the operation and maintenance of the annual state fair and
13	fairgrounds.
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15	(c) The state fair board shall:
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17	(i) Select from among its voting members a
18	chairman and a vice-chairman;
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20	(ii) Hold at least four (4) regular meetings per
21	year at such times and places as the chairman shall
22	specify. Special meetings may be called by the chairman or
23	upon request of a majority of the voting members. A

1	majority of the voting members of the state fair board
2	shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business;
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4	(iii) Be administratively supported by the
5	<pre>department;</pre>
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7	(iv) Provide for the year round operation and
8	maintenance of the state fairgrounds in a manner that:
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10	(A) Maximizes revenues but does not disrupt
11	the annual state fair;
12	
13	(B) Ensures the facilities are maintained
14	in good working order.

16	(v) Monitor any state fairgrounds facility needs
17	assessment conducted by the state construction department
18	and, subject to available funding, implement
19	recommendations received under subsection (d) of this
20	section to prioritize and remediate the identified needs;
21	
22	(vi) To the extent the employment of a state
23	fair manager would aid in accomplishing the duties required

by this chapter, appoint a state fair manager to conduct 1 2 and supervise the annual state fair and to manage the year 3 round operation and maintenance of the state fairgrounds. 4 Any appointment shall be made with the approval of the governor and shall be subject to removal authority provided 5 6 by W.S. 9-1-202. The state fair board may hire and provide for the supervision of other employees necessary to 7 8 accomplish the duties required by this chapter and may 9 contract for services to advertise and promote the annual 10 state fair and the fairgrounds; 11 12 (vii) To the extent establishing a subcommittee 13 would aid in executing the annual state fair, appoint a 14 subcommittee of state fair board members to plan, conduct or supervise the annual state fair. The director shall 15 16 serve as chairman of any subcommittee appointed under this 17 paragraph. 18 (d) The state construction department shall, in 19 20 addition to the comprehensive needs assessment conducted pursuant to W.S. 9-5-107, and upon request of the state 21 22 fair board:

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1	(i) Assess the state fairground buildings and
2	facility needs; and
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4	(ii) Submit recommendations to the state fair
5	board to prioritize and remediate the identified needs.
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7	(e) The Wyoming tourism board shall promote the
8	annual state fair throughout the state of Wyoming and
9	adjoining states.
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11	11-10-104. Catalogues.
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13	At least three (3) months before any annual fair, the
14	director of the department of agriculture state fair board
15	shall have a catalogue prepared and copies available for
16	distribution to any person requesting it.
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18	11-10-105. Entry fees.
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20	A fee may be charged for any in-state or out-of-state
21	exhibit to be entered in the state fair at an amount set by
22	the director of the department of agriculture and the <pre>state</pre>
23	fair board.

2 11-10-106. Admission charges; other revenues.

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4 (a) There shall be charged at the gates of the 5 fairground an admission fee to be set by the state fair 6 board. An extra charge may be made for seats in the 7 grandstand or other structure providing added comforts. The 8 charge for vehicles driven or stock ridden into the grounds 9 may be fixed by the state fair board. All fees collected 10 shall be deposited in the Wyoming state fair account.

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12 The department of agriculture may receive any 13 money or property of any kind or character donated, granted 14 or bequeathed for any activities of the state fair. Monies 15 shall be credited to the state fair account. The 16 department, on behalf of the state fair board, shall include within its biennial budget request submitted under 17 18 W.S. 9-2-1013 a report itemizing all gifts, income and 19 expenditures under this subsection for each of the 20 immediately preceding two (2) fiscal years.

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1 11-10-107. Power of state fair board to acquire land; authority to make rules and regulations; renting and use of 2 3 fairgrounds. 4 The Consistent with W.S. 9-5-106(a) and (c), the state fair 5 board may acquire by donation or lease in the name of the 6 state any lands necessary for conducting the annual state 7 8 fair, and may make all rules and regulations necessary for 9 the conduct and government of the exhibitions, the sale of 10 privileges, and the proper control, operation and conduct 11 of the annual state fair and the state fairgrounds not 12 inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state. 13 The state fair board may rent out or donate the use of the state fairgrounds for stabling and training stock and 14 15 holding stock sales. The grounds may be used free of charge 16 for encampment grounds for the state militia under the 17 direction of the adjutant general of the state. The board 18 may shall permit the grounds and facilities to be used for other purposes and may shall charge fees as it deems 19 20 necessary to maximize revenues and pay the expenses of 21 maintaining the grounds and facilities. The board shall not 22 permit any gambling device of any nature to be operated on

the grounds, or permit any unlawful betting, or permit any

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intoxicating liquors to be sold thereon except as provided

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2 by W.S. 12-4-505. 3 4 11-10-108. Rodeos; generally. 5 The director of the department of agriculture and the state 6 fair board may provide a rodeo as part of the state fair 7 8 program, provided there is no restriction on any Wyoming resident who desires to participate in the rodeo other than 9 10 the prescribed entry fee, unless the restriction is 11 required by a sanctioning body as part of the terms and 12 conditions to sanction the rodeo. Any contract entered into with any person to provide entertainment under this section 13 14 is void if it in any manner excludes a Wyoming resident 15 from participation in the entertainment because of 16 membership or nonmembership in any organization or group. 17 11-10-115. State fair board; membership; terms; 18 19 compensation. 20 21 (a) There is created the state fair advisory board

which shall serve as advisor to the board of agriculture on

the operation of the state fair and the operation and

2	advisory board shall consist of ten (10) consisting of the
3	<pre>following members:</pre>
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5	(i) One (1) voting member appointed by each of
6	the seven (7) members of the board of agriculture appointed
7	pursuant to W.S. 11-2-102(b), the governor from each of the
8	seven (7) appointment districts under W.S. 9-1-218. Each
9	of these members shall be engaged primarily in agricultural
10	work and shall be selected to represent a cross section of
11	the agriculture industry. Appointments shall rotate
12	consecutively among all the counties of the appointment
13	districts;
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15	(ii) One (1) voting member appointed by the
16	Converse county board of commissioners;
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18	(iii) One (1) voting member appointed by the
19	dean of the University of Wyoming college of agriculture
20	from the Wyoming cooperative extension service; and

22	(iv) One (1) voting member selected by the
23	Wyoming vocational agricultural teachers association from
20	myoming vocacional agricultural ceachers association from

1	its membership <u>;</u> . The state fair advisory board members
2	shall receive no salary in the performance of their duties
3	but shall receive mileage and per diem the same as state
4	employees as provided by W.S. 9-3-102.
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6	(v) One (1) voting member appointed by the
7	governor from the department of state parks and cultural
8	resources;
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10	(vi) One (1) voting member appointed by the
11	governor from the Wyoming business council;
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13	(vii) One (1) voting member appointed by the
14	governor from the Wyoming tourism board or a representative
15	of the Wyoming tourism board;
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17	(viii) One (1) voting member appointed by the
18	governor from the energy industry;
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20	(ix) The director shall serve as a voting
21	member;
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1 (x) The governor and the dean of the University
2 of Wyoming college of agriculture, or the dean's designee,
3 shall serve as nonvoting ex officio members.

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The members of the state fair advisory board member appointed by the Converse county board of commissioners, the state fair advisory board member appointed by the dean of the University of Wyoming college of agriculture and the state fair advisory board member selected by the Wyoming vocational agriculture teachers association shall serve a four (4) year term. All other state fair advisory board members shall serve at the pleasure of the person who appointed the state fair advisory board member and in no event shall the term of any state fair advisory member exceed the corresponding term of the appointing board of agriculture member. appointed under paragraph (a)(i) of this section shall serve for a term of six (6) years. The members of the state fair board appointed under paragraphs (a) (ii) through (viii) of this section shall serve for a term of four (4) years. Any state fair board member appointed by the governor is subject to removal as provided in W.S. 9-1-202.

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Τ	(c) Except as provided in this section, the state
2	fair board members shall be paid a salary of one hundred
3	dollars (\$100.00) per day for attending and traveling to
4	and from official state fair board business and shall
5	receive mileage and per diem in the same manner as state
6	employees as provided by W.S. 9-3-102. Members who are
7	government employees or public officials appointed to the
8	state fair board to represent an agency, department, board
9	or institution of the state, including the University of
10	Wyoming, shall receive no salary but shall be considered on
11	official business when performing duties as members of the
12	state fair board and shall receive mileage and per diem in
13	the manner provided by the agency, department, board or
14	institution the member represents.

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18 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this
19 section, the members of the state fair advisory board
20 holding office on the effective date of this act shall
21 serve as members of the state fair board for the remainder
22 of their respective terms and are eligible for
23 reappointment.

2 (b) Members of the state fair advisory board holding 3 office on the effective date of this act who were appointed 4 to the state fair advisory board by the members of the board of agriculture shall serve as members of the state 5 fair board for the remainder of their terms but in no event 6 for more than three (3) years from the effective date of 7 8 this act and, subject to W.S. 11-10-115(a)(i), are eligible 9 for reappointment.

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11 is appropriated ninety-five thousand There 12 (\$95,000.00) from the general fund to 13 department of agriculture. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act 14 15 and ending June 30, 2020. This appropriation shall only be 16 expended for payment of salary, per diem and mileage for 17 board members authorized state fair under 18 11-10-115(c). Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 19 this appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for 20 any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds 21 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 2020. This appropriation shall be 22 included in the 2021-2022 standard biennial budget request 23

submitted on behalf of the state fair board by the department of agriculture.

Section 3. This act is effective September 1, 2018.
