## A BILL

## for

1	AN ACT relating to physical therapy; modifying the scope of
2	practice of physical therapists; making a conforming
3	amendment; and providing for an effective date.

5	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
6	
7	<b>Section 1.</b> W.S. 33-25-102(c)(intro) and
8	33-25-111(a)(xii) are amended to read:
9	
10	33-25-102. Practice of physical therapy; license or
11	certificate required; exceptions; false representations.
12	
13	(c) <del>Except as provided in this subsection, <u>A</u> physical</del>
14	therapist with a master's degree, or a bachelor's degree with
15	five (5) years of clinical experience may initiate physical

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1	therapy treatment for <del>a <u>any</u> new or recurring injury<u>,</u> with or</del>
2	without a prescription from a licensed physician including
3	doctor of osteopathy, podiatrist, advanced practitioner of
4	nursing, dentist, chiropractor or physician assistant.
5	Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to preclude a
6	physical therapist from treating a chronic or recurring
7	injury or condition without a prescription, provided that the
8	patient or client was previously diagnosed and prescribed
9	physical therapy treatment within the previous year by a
10	health care provider identified in this subsection and the
11	treatment is directly related to the original prescribed
12	care. Except in an emergency, a physical therapist, without
13	a prescription, is prohibited from initiating physical
14	therapy treatment for children under the age of twelve (12)
15	years, unless the child is to receive physical therapy
16	treatment under an individualized education program or an
17	individualized family services plan. A physical therapist
18	shall refer the patient or client to a licensed physician
19	including doctor of osteopathy, podiatrist, advanced
20	practitioner of nursing, dentist, chiropractor or physician
21	assistant, as appropriate, when: or other health care
22	provider, except that a physical therapist shall refer a
23	patient or client to another health care provider to diagnose

1	or care for the patient or client if the physical therapist
2	reasonably believes that conditions may be present that
3	require health care services beyond the scope of physical
4	therapy practice.

6	33-25-111. Discipline; denial or suspension of license
7	or certificate; grounds.
8	
9	(a) The board may revoke, suspend, restrict, condition,
10	reprimand, refuse to issue or refuse to renew the license or
11	certification of any individual who:
12	
13	(xii) Fails to refer a patient or client <del>or post</del>
14	information as required by W.S. <del>33-25-102(e) <u>33-25-102(c)</u>;</del>
15	
16	Section 2. W.S. 33-25-102(c)(i) through (iii) and (e)
17	is repealed.

19	Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
