1 AN ACT relating to educators; modifying national board 2 teacher certification incentive programs; repealing obsolete provisions; and providing for an effective date. 3 4 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 5 6 7 Section 1. W.S. 21-7-501(a)(intro), (i), (ii), by 8 creating a new paragraph (iv), (c), (f)(intro), (ii), (v) and 9 by creating a new subsection (g) is amended to read: 10 11 21-7-501. National certification program; program 12 limits and requirements; appropriations requirements; 13 certified teacher pay incentive reimbursement. 14 15 (a) The professional teaching standards board shall by 16 rule department of education may enter into an agreement with

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1	a nonprofit entity to establish a program under which school
2	districts shall reimburse no more than fifty (50) the
3	department or the nonprofit entity will administer a program
4	to assist teachers in earning national board teacher
5	certification. The agreement between the department and the
6	nonprofit entity shall require biennial reporting by the
7	nonprofit entity to the department. The program may provide
8	professional development and mentoring specific to national
9	board teacher certification, along with other activities
10	related to national certification. Additionally, on behalf of
11	teachers and certified or licensed service providers employed
12	by Wyoming school districts the program may make payments
13	directly to an organization that provides national board
14	teacher certification for not more than fifty percent (50%)
15	of the actual cost of receiving fees to receive national
16	certification, not to exceed the national certification fee
17	as established by the national board for professional
18	teaching standards. for the applicable year certification was
19	received, provided The program shall only make payments if:
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21	(i) The teacher has completed at least three (3)
22	years of teaching <mark>;</mark> in the state of Wyoming;
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1	(ii) The teacher or service provider, as
2	applicable, was successful in receiving his national
3	certification timely pays the teacher's portion of the
4	certification fees and timely completes progress toward
5	certification as required by the program; and
6	
7	(iv) The teacher agrees to reimburse the program
8	for any certification fee payments the program makes on behalf
9	of the teacher in the event the teacher fails to formally
10	withdraw from the process or to submit an entry that can be
11	scored, as determined by the program.
12	
13	(c) A school district The legislature may apply for an
14	innovative program grant under W.S. 21-22-106(a)(iii) to
15	recover amounts reimbursed to teachers and service providers
16	under subsection (b) of this section appropriate funds to the
17	department to implement subsection (a) of this section. No
18	funds appropriated by the legislature shall be distributed
19	to the program if the nonprofit entity with whom the
20	department has entered into an agreement under subsection (a)
21	of this section does not contribute to the program an amount
22	equal to the amount that will be distributed from funds
23	appropriated by the legislature. The department shall ensure

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that state funds and funds the nonprofit entity provides to 1 2 the program shall be accounted for separately. 3 4 (f) In addition to reimbursement of the cost of 5 national board certification the program established under 6 subsection $\frac{b}{a}$ of this section, and to promote employment of national board certified teachers by school districts, 7 8 each district employing a national board certified teacher 9 shall be reimbursed for payments to these teachers subject to 10 the following: 11 12 (ii) Effective school year 2007-2008 and each school year thereafter, The teacher holding certification 13 14 shall be employed by the district full time full time as a 15 teacher;. For purposes of this subsection, "teacher" shall 16 include employees of the district holding certification and 17 employed full-time as instructional facilitators, certified 18 tutors, librarians or counselors; 19 20 (v) Not later than December 31, 2007, and each

21 December 31 thereafter January 31 of each year, the department 22 shall report to the joint education interim committee on 23 district reports submitted under paragraph (iii) of this

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1	subsection and estimated distributions under this subsection
2	to eligible districts for the applicable reporting period.
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4	(g) For purposes of this section, "teacher" means a
5	school district employee holding certification and employed
6	full time as a teacher, instructional facilitator, certified
7	tutor, librarian, speech-language therapist or counselor.
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9	Section 2 . W.S. 21-7-501(a)(iii), (b) and (d) is
10	repealed.
11	
12	Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
