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21 (b) Scholarships under this section shall be for a

22 maximum of the equivalent of eight (8) full-time semesters.

23 Except as specified under subsection (g) of this section, A

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paragraph (i) of this subsection and who earns a certificate

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1 from the community college with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2 2.25 may extend the provisional opportunity scholarship to 3 pursue either a certificate or a degree at a Wyoming community 4 college or if the student earns a degree from the community 5 college with a minimum GPA of 2.25, may extend the scholarship to pursue a degree at the University of Wyoming if the student 6 maintains a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 and otherwise 7 8 remains eligible for a scholarship under this article. A 9 student who receives a scholarship under paragraph (i) of 10 this subsection, is enrolled in a community college baccalaureate program and has received a minimum cumulative 11 12 GPA of 2.25 after four (4) full-time semesters may extend the 13 provisional opportunity scholarship for an additional four (4) full-time semesters to complete the baccalaureate degree 14 if the student maintains a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 and 15 otherwise remains eligible for a scholarship under this 16 article. The scholarship under this paragraph shall be for 17 18 the same amounts and subject to the same limitations as 19 provided for scholarships under paragraph (a)(i) of this 20 section, except that the student may continue a baccalaureate 21 program or pursue either an additional certificate or a degree and the student may use this scholarship while attending a 22

Wyoming community college or the University of Wyoming.

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22	(d) The commission shall perform the following approval
23	functions:

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(i) Approve all new <u>academic</u> programs, <u>including</u> baccalaureate degree programs, qualifying for state funding pursuant to the statewide community college strategic plan developed under subsection (h) of this section. For each community college, the commission may approve up to ten (10) baccalaureate degree programs in the applied sciences and up to three (3) additional baccalaureate degree programs in any discipline;

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11 The commission shall prior to the beginning of each (h) 12 biennial budget period, review, update and modify the 13 statewide college system strategic plan. The plan shall 14 clearly prescribe the components of the educational program 15 and attach program components to statewide system priorities. 16 This plan shall serve as the basis for state operational and capital construction budget requests and funding of the 17 statewide college system for the applicable biennial budget 18 19 period. In developing, reviewing and updating the strategic 20 plan, the commission shall:

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22 (ii) Include mechanisms within the planning 23 process which adhere to the state's interests in establishing

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1 (xvi) Confer degrees and certificates, including 2 baccalaureate degrees in programs approved by the commission, 3 and grant diplomas as are usual for community colleges and 4 authorized under its accreditation by the regional 5 accrediting agency; 6 7 Section 2. The University of Wyoming shall consult with 8 community college commission for the purpose of the 9 identifying potential baccalaureate programs to be offered at 10 the Wyoming community colleges. The University of Wyoming and 11 the community college commission shall report to the joint 12 education interim committee by May 1, 2019, August 1, 2019, November 1, 2019 and May 1, 2020 on the status of the 13 consultations. The reports to the committee shall include 14 15 identification of potential baccalaureate programs, 16 implementation schedule, associated costs and other 17 associated resource needs. 18 19 Section 3. 20 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this 21 22 section, this act is effective July 1, 2019.

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1 (b) Sections 2 and 3 of this act are effective 2 immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill 3 to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 4 Wyoming Constitution. 5
